1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to establish Petitioner was eligible for and received a Selective Retention Bonus (SRB) and Early Reenlistment Kicker.

2. The Board, consisting of [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 27 October 2022 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:

a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.

b. On 22 August 2016, Petitioner entered active duty.

c. On 5 April 2017, Petitioner was assigned Primary Military Occupational Specialties (PMOS) 0621.

d. On 24 May 2017, Petitioner was assigned ADMOS1 0622.

e. On 9 August 2019, Petitioner reenlisted for 4 years with an End of Current Contract (ECC) of 8 August 2023.

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f. On 2 November 2019, Petitioner was promoted to Sergeant/E-5.

g. In accordance with reference (b), this MARADMIN announces the SRB program and the Broken Service SRB (BSSRB) program authorized for FY23. With the advent of several new SRB programs, Marines are encouraged to thoroughly review the contents of this bulletin. First term Marines (Zone A) and career Marines (Zone B, C, D, E, F, and G) who reenlist on or after 14 June 2022 are eligible for the FY23 SRB program. This will include any regular component first term or career Marine with an ECC from 1 October 2022 to 30 September 2023.

FY23 Cohort In-Year Early Reenlistment Kicker. Marines in Zone A who submit for a minimum of 48 month reenlistment before 30 September 2022 with a PMOS that is listed in paragraph 3.m, are subsequently approved, will rate an 8,000 dollar Early Reenlistment Kicker in addition to the PMOS bonus amount listed in paragraph(s) 3.m, 3.n, and 3.o. After 30 September 2022, this Early Reenlistment Kicker will expire.

Zone A applies to those active component Marines with 17 months to 6 years of active military service. First term Marines with exactly 6 years of active military service on the date of reenlistment may be paid a Zone A PMOS bonus if they have not previously received a Zone A PMOS bonus. Zone A PMOS bonus payments for Marines who reenlist for at least 48 months obligated service are authorized as listed below in dollars (bonuses for Marines who reenlist for 36 to 47 months obligated service will be calculated as per para 3.j). Furthermore, a zone "A" SRB for MOS 0621, E-5, which is capped at \$8,000 for 48 months of additional obligated service is authorized.

h. On 12 July 2022, Petitioner's Careerist Active Duty Reenlistment request was submitted, and approved by Headquarters, U.S. Marine Corps on 27 September 2022.

i. On 22 August 2022, Petitioner entered zone "B."

j. On 30 September 2022, Petitioner reenlisted for 4 years with an ECC of 29 September 2026.

k. In correspondence attached as enclosure (2), the office having cognizance over the subject matter addressed in Petitioner's application has commented to the effect that the request has merit and warrants favorable action.

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded that on 12 July 22, Petitioner submitted a 48-month reenlistment with a Zone A SRB request to HQMC. On 23 August 2022, Petitioner entered Zone B. On 27 September 2022, Petitioner was approved for a 48-month reenlistment. Due to processing time and at no fault of Petitioner, his reenlistment request was not approved until after he crossed into Zone B, making him ineligible for the Zone A SRB.

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RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner was discharged and reenlisted on 19/20 August 2022 vice 29/30 September 2022 for a term of 5 years vice 4 years.

Note: This change will entitle the member to a zone "A" SRB for MOS 0621, E-5, which is capped at \$8,000 for 48 months of additional obligated service. Remaining obligated service to 8 August 2023 will be deducted from SRB computation. Furthermore, Petitioner is entitled to the \$8,000 Early Reenlistment Kicker.

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.

5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(e)), and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of the reference, has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
