


This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Section 1552 of Title 10, United States Code. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) found the evidence submitted insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 25 October 2022. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

You requested advancement to Electronics Technician Second Class (ETR2)/E-5. The Board, in its review of your entire record and application, carefully weighed all potentially mitigating factors, to include your assertions. The Board concluded that although you may have participated in the September 2019 (Cycle 244) and the March 2020 (Cycle 247) Navy Wide Advancement Exams (NWAE), the Naval Education and Training Professional Development Center did not receive answer sheets for either cycle. Therefore a standard score comparison was completed from your September 2020 (Cycle 248) NWAE to the aforementioned missed cycles. However, your final multiple scores (FMS) did not exceed the minimum multiple required (MMR) for advancement. Your FMS for Cycle 244 was 69.13 and the MMR for advancement was 104.02 and the FMS for Cycle 247 was 68.67, and the MMR was 81.27, thereby rendering you ineligible for advancement to ETR2/E-5 for either cycle. Additionally, you did not earn any pass not advanced-PNA points for either cycle.

You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new matters, which will require you to complete and submit a new DD Form 149. New matters are those not previously presented to or considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when



applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.
