- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting adjustment to the reentry code listed on his Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 214). Enclosures (1) through (3) apply.
- 2. The Board, consisting of property of the Board, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of his naval service records, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.
- 3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice finds as follows:
- a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.
- b. Although enclosure (1) was not filed in a timely manner, it is in the interest of justice to review the application on its merits.
- c. Petitioner enlisted in the Marine Corps Reserves and began a period of active duty on 7 July 1998. After three honorable periods of service, on 25 August 2000, Petitioner was honorably discharged.
- f. On 15 September 2000, Petitioner began a fourth period of active duty service. On 1 June 2006, Petitioner received a Page 11 entry indicating that he was assigned an RE-3O reentry code.

- g. On 10 September 2006, Petitioner was honorably discharged from Service after completing his required active service. On the same date, Petitioner was issued a DD Form 214 indicating the following errors: block 25. separation authority reflecting MARCORSEPMAN PAR- "2005" vice "1005," separation code reflecting "MBK2" vice "KBK1," reentry code reflecting "RE-24" vice "RE-30," and a narrative reason for separation reflecting "voluntary (USMC) IADT" vice "completion of required active duty service."
- h. Petitioner contends the DD Form 214 he received upon discharge reflects an incorrect reentry code. Petitioner is seeking to get this corrected so that he may join the USNR.

CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board determined the Petitioner's request warrants relief. As noted above, the Board identified a series of administrative errors with the DD Form 214 issued to Petitioner upon his most recent release from active duty.

In view of the above, the Board directs the following corrective action.

RECOMMENDATION:

Petitioner be issued a Correction to DD Form 214, Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 215), indicating, for the period ending on 10 September 2006, that his separation authority was MARCORSEPMAN PAR-"1005," separation code was "KBK1," reentry code was "RE-3O," and narrative reason for separation was "completion of required active duty service."

That a copy of this report of proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

- 4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.
- 5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulation, Section 723.6(e)) and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of reference (a), has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
