1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to establish Petitioner's Foreign and/or Sea Service on his Armed Forces of the United States Report of Transfer or Discharge (DD Form 214) effective 28 January 1964.

2. The Board, consisting of [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 26 January 2023 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, found that, before applying to this Board, he exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board made the following findings:

a. Petitioner assigned to the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] for continuous sea duty from 29 August 1959 to 21 February 1961.

b. On 28 January 1964, Petitioner released from active duty and issued DD Form 214 with Block 24c (Foreign and/or Sea Service) reflecting 00 years, 00 month, and 00 days.

#### CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded Petitioner completed Foreign and/or Sea Service while assigned to [REDACTED] therefore, relief is warranted.

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner's DD Form 214, Armed Forces of the United States Report of Transfer or Discharge ending on 28 January 1964 is amended to reflect Block 24c (Foreign and/or Sea Service "01 05 23" vice "00 00 00."

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
