CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board determined that the Petitioner's record warrants relief.

While the Board noted Petitioner's record reflects two different dates of birth, the Board concluded that his correct date of birth is as reflected on his birth certificate and he should be issued a corrected DD Form 214 to ensure he is not denied any veterans' benefits.

In view of the above, the Board directs the following corrective action.

RECOMMENDATION:

That Petitioner be issued a Correction to Report of Separation from Armed Forces of the United States (DD Form 215) which corrects his date of birth to "armed".

That a copy of this Report of Proceedings be filed in Petitioner's Naval record.
