Petitioner was released from active duty and transferred to the Naval Reserve with an Honorable character of service and was issued a Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 214) for the period of 19 September 2017 to 18 October 2022 upon completion of required active service.

## CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of reference (b) and enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded that Petitioner was entitled to receive BAH at the with dependents rate starting 22 December 2021, the day her son was born. Petitioner signed the Record of Emergency Data on 12 August 2022, however, due to administrative oversight, Petitioner's BAH entitlement was not started.

## RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner was authorized BAH at the with dependents rate for 22 December 2021 to 18 October 2022.

Note: Defense Finance & Accounting Service (DFAS) will complete an audit of Petitioner's records to determine if Petitioner is due any back pay.

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
