- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting her record to be corrected to change the social security number (SSN) listed on her discharge documents.
- 2. The Board consisting of _____, and ____ reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 13 January 2023 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of Petitioner's application together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of Former Member's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.
- 3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice finds as follows:
- a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.
- b. Although the enclosure was not filed in a timely manner, it is in the interest of justice to review the application on its merits.
- c. Petitioner enlisted in the Navy and began a period of active duty on 24 April 1963. At the time of her enlistment she indicated her social security number (SSN) as
- d. On 5 June 1964, she was discharged with an honorable character of service. Upon her discharge, Petitioner was issued an Armed Forces of the United States Report of Transfer or Discharged (DD Form 214) reflecting her SSN as
- e. On 29 June 2011, Navy Personnel Command (NPC) directed a change to Petitioner's record to reflect her SSN as

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f. Petitioner requests correction of the SNN listed on her DD Form 214 contending that the previous SSN indicating in her record belonged to her father.

CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board concludes that Petitioner's request warrants favorable action.

The Board noted that NPC previously directed a change to the Petitioner's record to reflect the proper SSN, but no correction was ever made to the DD Form 214. NPC's authorization to correct her record and Petitioner's submitted documentation lends credence to her contention that the wrong SSN was used during her military service.

In view of the foregoing, the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action:

RECOMMENDATION:

That Petitioner be issued a Correction to DD Form 214, Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty DD Form 214 (DD Form 215) indicting her SSN as

That no further changes be made to Petitioner's record.

That a copy of this Report of Proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
