1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to establish Petitioner was eligible for and received a Selective Reenlistment Bonus (SRB).

2. The Board, consisting of [REDACTED], and [REDACTED], reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 8 December 2022 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:

a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.

b. On 12 July 2017, Petitioner entered active duty for 4 years with an End of Active Obligated Service (EAOS) of 11 July 2021 and Soft End of Active Obligated Service (SEAOS) of 11 July 2022.

c. In accordance with reference (b), this NAVADMIN announced revised SRB policy for Active Component (AC) and Full-Time Support (FTS), superseding NAVADMIN 272/19. Sailors must now have reenlisted within 365-days of their EAOS (as opposed to 270-days required in NAVADMIN 272/19), except in the case of Nuclear-trained Sailors who could have reenlisted at any point in the reenlistment zone, per guidance in OPNAVINST 1160.8B.

d. On 31 March 2021, Deputy Chief of Naval Personnel notified Petitioner that he was authorized immediate in-rate reenlistment in the active component with an end date of July 2022.

e. In accordance with reference (c), FY22 SRB Award Plan (N13 SRB 001/FY22) a zone "A" SRB with an award level of 0.5 ([REDACTED] award ceiling) for the GSM rate was listed.

f. On 14 March 2022, Petitioner signed a command career request (NPPSC 1160/1) requesting a 3 year reenlistment effective 10 May 2022. Petitioner's request was approved on 5 April 2022 by cognizant authority.

g. On 29 March 2022, Petitioner was issued official change duty orders (BUPERS order: 0882) with required obligated service to September 2025, while stationed in [REDACTED] with an effective date of departure of July 2022. Petitioner's ultimate activity was [REDACTED] for duty with an effective date of arrival of 26 August 2022, with a Projected Rotation Date (PRD) of September 2025.

h. On 10 May 2022, Petitioner reenlisted for 3 years with an EAOS of 9 May 2025 (SEAOS of 9 February 2026).

i. On 2 June 2022, Petitioner was issued official modification to change duty orders (BUPERS order: 0882) with required obligated service to February 2026, while stationed in [REDACTED] with an effective date of departure of January 2023. Petitioner's ultimate activity was [REDACTED] for duty with an effective date of arrival of 6 February 2023, with a PRD of 6 February 2026.

j. In correspondence attached as enclosure (2), the office having cognizance over the subject matter addressed in Petitioner's application has commented to the effect that the request has merit and warrants favorable action.

## CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded that at the time of Petitioner's reenlistment, Petitioner met the requirements to be awarded an SRB for his skillset of GSM in Zone A. If the Command Career Counselor had submitted the SRB precertification request 35 to 120 days in advance of Petitioner's requested reenlistment date, it would have been approved.

## RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner's Command submitted a waiver request for his SRB to BUPERS-328 via OPINS/NSIPS less than 35 days in advance of the requested reenlistment date of the Sailor and was approved by cognizant authority.
