Dear ██████████:

This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Section 1552 of Title 10, United States Code. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) found the evidence submitted insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 12 January 2023. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies. In addition, the Board also considered the advisory opinion by Branch Head, Community Management Support Branch memorandum 1160 Ser B328/132 of 30 November 2022, which was previously provided to you. You were afforded an opportunity to submit a rebuttal, but did not do so.

On 14 March 2017, you entered active duty for 4 years with an End of Active Obligated Service (EAOS) of 13 March 2021 and Soft End of Active Obligated Service (SEAOS) of 13 March 2022. In December 2017, you were awarded NEC L04A (Aerospace Medical Technician). In March 2018, you were awarded NEC L03A (Field Medical Service Technician).

In accordance with NAVADMIN 108/20 published on 15 April 2020, this NAVADMIN announced revised selective reenlistment bonus (SRB) policy for Active Component (AC) and Full-Time Support (FTS), superseding NAVADMIN 272/19. Sailors must now have reenlisted within 365-days of their EAOS (as opposed to 270-days required in reference (a)), except in the case of Nuclear-trained Sailors who could reenlist at any point in the reenlistment zone, per guidance in OPNAVINST 1160.8B.

In accordance with FY21 SRB Award Plan (N13SRB 005/FY21) published on 9 August 2021, a zone "A" SRB for the HM/L03A/L04A rate/NEC was not listed.
