- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) requesting correction of his social security number (SSN). Enclosure (1) applies.
- 2. The Board, consisting of partial pa
- 3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:
- a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.
- b. Petitioner enlisted in the Navy and began a period of active duty on 12 January 1966. At the time of his enlistment, his contract indicated that the first three digits of his SSN were "which were consistently entered throughout his service records. He was honorably discharged and transferred into the Naval Reserve on 27 October 1969. At that time, the SSN recorded in block 3 of his Certificate of Discharge or Release from Active Duty (DD Form 214) also had "the entered for the first three digits."
- c. Petitioner contends his correct SSN has "are" as the first three digits and that the second and third numbers were transposed in his record. In support of this contention, he submits evidence of his social security card, issued on May which indicates that the first three digits of his SSN are "are" rather than "are".

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CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board concluded that Petitioner's request warrants favorable action. The Board reviewed his application under the guidance provided in the references and concluded that the SSN used throughout Petitioner's service was erroneous in light of the clear transposition between that on has federally issued social security card and that contained in his service records. Accordingly, the Board determined that Petitioner's request merits the relief in the form of correcting this error.

In view of the foregoing, the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action.

RECOMMENDATION:

That Petitioner be issued a Correction to Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 215) indicating that the data in block 3 of his DD 214 should read "..."

That no further changes be made to Petitioner's record.

A copy of this report of proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

- 5.
