(2) Case summary

- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that he be issued a complete Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 214) for the period from 12 June 2012 to 24 October 2013.
- 2. The Board, consisting of the property of the Board, and the pursuant to its regulations, determined the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of his naval service records, applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.
- 3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:
- a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.
- b. Although enclosure (1) was not filed in a timely manner, it is in the interest of justice to review the application on its merits.

d. Upon his release from active duty, he was issued the Member-1 copy of his DD Form 214 covering the period 12 June 2012 to 24 October 2013. The Service-2 copy was not found in his official military personnel file (OMPF). Petitioner contends that they did not submit the Service-2 copy to his OMPF and, due to the length of time since his discharge, are unable to create a new DD Form for this period.

CONCLUSION:

The Board noted the Petitioner's official military personnel record (OMPF) does contain evidence that he was mobilized to active duty (History of Assignments, Evaluation Report and Counseling Record, and Statement of Service) and is eligible to receive a DD Form 214 covering the mobilization period. The Board was unable to validate the exact dates Petitioner was mobilized and directs Navy Personnel Command to validate the time on active duty.

In view of the above, the Board directs the following corrective action:

RECOMMENDATION:

That Navy Personnel Command determine the dates Petitioner was mobilized from 2012 to 2013.

Petitioner be issued a DD 214 covering the above period and indicate his character of service as Honorable, separation authority as MILPERSMAN 1910-104, separation code as MBK, narrative reason for separation as "Completion of Required Active Service" and reentry code as "RE-R1."

No further changes be made to Petitioner's record.

A copy of this report of proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

- 4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.
- 5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulation, Section 723.6(e)) and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of reference (a), has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
