(2) Case summary

- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting he be issued a Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 214) to document his last period of honorable service.
- 2. The Board, consisting of particles allegations of error and injustice on 1 February 2023, and, pursuant to its regulations, determined the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of his naval service records, applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.
- 3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:
- a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.
- b. Although enclosure (1) was not filed in a timely manner, it is in the interest of justice to review the application on its merits.
- c. Petitioner enlisted in the U.S. Navy and began a period of active duty on 24 September 1978. He completed his active obligated service on 24 June 1982 with an Honorable characterization of service. He immediately reenlisted on 25 June 1982. He completed his second period of active obligated service on 23 June 1988 with an Honorable characterization. He immediately reenlisted again on 24 June 1988. He completed this active obligated service on 24 June 1991 with an Honorable characterization of service. Again, he immediately reenlisted on 25 June 1991. On 17 January 1995, his fleet reserve request was approved with an effective

date of 30 September 1995. He completed his active obligated service on 30 September 1995 and was transferred to the Fleet Reserve with an Honorable characterization of service.

d. A review of Petitioner's record shows that it is missing a DD Form 214 for his period of active duty covering 25 June 1991 – 30 September 1995.

CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board concludes that Petitioner's request warrants relief.

The Board determined it was in the interests of justice to properly document his service. Therefore, the Board concluded Petitioner should be reissued DD Form 214s to document all periods of honorable service.

RECOMMENDATION:

In view of the above, the Board directs the following corrective action:

Petitioner be issued a DD Form 214, for the period ending 30 September 1995, stating that his characterization of service was "Honorable," his separation reason as "Early Retirement," his separation code as "NBE," his separation authority as "MILPERSMAN 3855180," and his reentry code of "RE-2."

No further changes be made to Petitioner's record.

A copy of this report of proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

- 4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.
- 5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulation, Section 723.6(e)) and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of reference (a), has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
