1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to issue him a Certificate of Release or Discharge (DD Form 214) from 1989 through 1991 to include Sea Service.

2. The Board, consisting of [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 28 February 2023 and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, found that, before applying to this Board, he exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board made the following findings:

a. On 22 December 1983, Petitioner enlisted in the Navy Reserve for a term of 6 years, of which 4 years was an active duty obligation, and entered active duty on 3 October 1984. On 26 April 1985 he reported to the USS [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]).

b. On 6 September 1988, Petitioner discharged for immediate reenlistment on 7 September 1988 and issued a DD Form 214 for active duty period of 3 October 1984 to 6 September 1988; 3 years, 4 months and 11 days.

c. On 4 October 1988, Petitioner detached the USS [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]) and reported to NAVSCSCOLDET [REDACTED], [REDACTED] on 5 October 1988 through 10 January 1989. Thereafter, Petitioner reported to NCS, [REDACTED], followed by SATCOM, [REDACTED] where he advanced to Radioman Second Class (RM2)/E-5 effective 16 June 1990.

d. On 31 October 1991, Petitioner reenlisted for a term of 6 years. Petitioner's official military personnel file (OMPF) does not contain a DD Form 214 for the active duty period of 7 September 1988 to 30 October 1991.

e. On 23 March 1993, Petitioner voluntarily discharged for early release program-SSB and issued DD Form 214 for active duty period 31 October 1991 to 23 March 1993. This DD Form 214 included 27 days of Sea Service that is not accounted for in Petitioner's OMPF.

f. Petitioner executed back-to-back reenlistments in the Navy Reserve beginning on 24 March 1993 until his transfer to the Retired Reserve without pay effective 1 January 2009.

#### CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded there is no evidence in Petitioner's OMPF that indicates a DD Form 214 for active duty service of 7 September 1988 to 30 October 1991 was issued as required by reference (b).<sup>1</sup> Additionally, the Board noted, Petitioner's DD Form 214 dated 23 March 1993 erroneously reflects 27 days of Sea Service that should be annotated on DD Form 214 from 7 September 1988 to 30 October 1991 for remaining period of service assigned to the USS [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. Therefore, the Board felt, under these circumstances, relief is warranted.

#### RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner issued DD Form 214 for the period of 7 September 1988 to 30 October 1991 to include 27 days of Sea Service.

Petitioner's DD Form 214 dated 23 March 1993 is amended to reflect block 12g (Sea Service) "00 00 00" vice "00 00 27."

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.

5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(e)), and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of the reference, has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
