1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that her naval record be corrected to reflect declined participation in the Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP).
2. The Board, consisting of [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 15 February 2023 and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.
3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, found that, before applying to this Board, she exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board made the following findings:
 - a. Petitioner married [REDACTED] on 5 December 2013.
 - b. On 1 November 2019 Petitioner signed DD Form 2656, Data for Payment of Retired Personnel electing SBP Spouse and Children coverage, however, the SBP level of coverage was not selected.
 - c. Petitioner transferred to the Fleet Reserve effective 1 March 2020 and was automatically enrolled in SBP¹ Spouse only coverage.

¹ Reference (b), SBP elections must be made prior to retired pay becoming payable and the election to participate in or decline SBP is irrevocable. If not all requirements for an election needing the spouse's concurrence have not been satisfied prior to retirement, for whatever reason, full spouse costs, and coverage will be implemented, regardless of any request by the member to do otherwise. Any change in SBP election subsequent to retirement will be done through an administrative correction of records as permitted by law. However, service members are eligible to discontinue SBP coverage by submitting DD Form 2656-2, SBP Termination Request to Defense Finance and Accounting Service, during a 1-year period, which begins on the second anniversary of the date of commencement of retired pay.

d. On 29 December 2022 Petitioner signed DD Form 2656-2, SBP Termination Request; Petitioner's spouse signed on 9 January 2023 before a notary witness concurring with Petitioner's decision to terminate participation in SBP. Thereafter, the form was submitted to DFAS for processing.

e. On 10 February 2023 Petitioner and spouse signed SBP Affidavit before a notary witness requesting to decline SBP coverage.

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded Petitioner provided sufficient evidence to reflect her and spouse's desire to decline SBP coverage. Although Petitioner did not complete the proper administrative requirements, the Board felt that under this circumstance, relief is warranted.

RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner elected to decline participation in SBP with spouse concurrence prior to transferring to the Fleet Reserve effective 1 March 2020.

Note: DFAS will complete an audit of Petitioner's pay records to determine the amount of premium refund.

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.

5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(e)), and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of the reference, has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
