- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that her naval record be corrected to reflect declined participation in the Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP).
- 2. The Board, consisting of ______, _____ and _____ reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 9 March 2023 and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.
- 3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, found that, before applying to this Board, she exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board made the following findings:
- a. On 3 February 2022, Petitioner signed DD Form 2656, Data for Payment of Retired Personnel electing as a Natural Person with Insurable Interest (NIP).
- b. Petitioner transferred to the Fleet Reserve effective 1 October 2022 and SBP NIP coverage began.
- c. On 23 November 2022 the Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) received DD Form 2656, Data for Payment of Retired Personnel signed by Petitioner and Witness on 24 May 2022, indicating her election to decline SBP coverage, however, the form was incomplete.

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded Petitioner's record reflects she was not married at time of retirement and provided sufficient evidence to reflect her desire to decline participation in SBP coverage prior to transferring to the Fleet Reserve. Although Petitioner did not complete the proper administrative requirements, the Board felt under these circumstances, relief is warranted.

RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner elected to decline participation in SBP prior to transferring to the Fleet Reserve effective 1 October 2022.

Note: DFAS will complete an audit of Petitioner's pay records to determine the amount of premium refund.

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

- 4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.
- 5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(e)), and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of the reference, has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
