1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to show Petitioner received Career Sea Pay Premium (CSP-P) for the period of 8 July 2021 to 30 September 2022.

2. The Board, consisting of [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 9 March 2023 and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice finds as follows:

a. On 18 January 2017, Petitioner entered active duty.

b. On 21 May 2018, Petitioner was issued official change duty orders (BUPERS order: 1418) while stationed in [REDACTED] with an effective date of departure of June 2018. Petitioner's ultimate activity was [REDACTED] for duty with an effective date of arrival of 9 July 2018, with a Projected Rotation Date (PRD) of July 2022.

c. On 21 June 2018, Petitioner transferred from [REDACTED], and arrived to [REDACTED] on 8 July 2018 for duty and Career Sea Pay was started.

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d. On 20 March 2019, Petitioner was advanced to STS3/E-4.

e. On 29 March 2022, Petitioner was issued official change duty orders (BUPERS order: 0882) with required obligated service to November 2025, while stationed in [REDACTED] with an effective date of departure of September 2022. Petitioner's intermediate (1) activity was [REDACTED] for temporary duty under instruction with an effective date of arrival of 22 October 2022. Petitioner's ultimate activity was [REDACTED] for duty with an effective date of arrival of 30 November 2022, with a PRD of November 2025.

f. On 30 September 2022, Petitioner transferred from [REDACTED] and Career Sea Pay stopped. Petitioner arrived to [REDACTED] on 22 October 2022 for temporary duty.

g. On 16 December 2022, Petitioner was advanced to STS2/E-5.

## CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2),<sup>1</sup> the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded that Petitioner became entitled to CSP-P while still attached to the [REDACTED]. In accordance with reference (c),<sup>2</sup> Petitioner would have been entitled to CSP-P payment beginning his 37th month. Therefore, the Board determined that Petitioner's entitlement to CSP-P is from 8 July 2021 to 30 September 2022.

## RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner was entitled to CSP-P for the period of 8 July 2021 to 30 September 2022.

Note: Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) will complete an audit of Petitioner's records to determine retroactive CSP-P entitlement.

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.

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<sup>1</sup> Advisory opinion, attached as enclosure (2), the office having cognizance over the subject matter addressed in Petitioner's application has commented to the effect that the request has merit and warrants favorable action.

<sup>2</sup> Reference (c), CSP-P is special pay that is in addition to CSP and is paid for unusually long periods of continuous sea duty. A member entitled to CSP who has served 36 consecutive months of sea duty is also entitled to CSP-P for the 37th consecutive month and each subsequent consecutive month of sea duty served. When payable as a separate item, CSP-P accrues from the first day following the completion of the 36th month of consecutive sea duty and will be prorated if beginning on other than the first day of a calendar month.

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5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(e)), and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of the reference, has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
