c. Petitioner contends the last two digits of his SSN and his first name are incorrect. Petitioner was told by his office of personnel that these errors will be corrected and to cross out the last two digits and replace them with the correct numbers. Petitioner states he did what he was told and used it that way ever since. Petitioner claims no one questioned him about this matter until he tried to apply for a veteran exception for tags in
CONCLUSION:
Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board determined that the Petitioner's request warrants favorable action. The Board notes the Petitioner's naval record incorrectly documents his SSN as "" "vice "" "." Therefore, the Board determined it contains an administrative error that requires correction. Further, the Board determined it was in the interests of justice to change Petitioner's record to reflect his current name of " "vice "."
In view of the above, the Board directs the following corrective action.
RECOMMENDATION:
That Petitioner's naval record be corrected to reflect the correct name as " and his SSN as
That Petitioner be issued a new Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 214).
That a copy of this Report of Proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
