This letter is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Title 10, United States Code, Section 1552. After careful and conscientious consideration of the entire record, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) found the evidence submitted was insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 21 March 2023. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

The Board carefully considered your request for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 Enlisted Remedial Selection Board (ERSB) to consider you for selection to the grade of master sergeant (MSgt)/E-8. The Board considered your contention that your fitness report for the reporting period 1 October 2020 to 30 September 2021 was delayed in posting to your official military personnel file (OMPF) and was not on your Master Brief Sheet (MBS) at the time the FY22 Reserve SNCO Promotion Selection Board (PSB) convened. Therefore, you argue that your record did not receive full consideration by the PSB.

The Board, however, determined that your contentions are without merit. In this regard, the Board noted that the PSB convened on 19 January 2022 and adjourned on 1 March 2022. On 31 May 2022 you requested remedial promotion consideration from the Promotion Branch (MMPR-2), however, your request was denied. MMPR-2 provided verification that the contested report was added to your OMPF on 26 January 2022 and was viewed by the PSB. Therefore, the Board determined that you were properly considered by the PSB but not selected for promotion to MSgt. The Board thus concluded that your petition did not demonstrate probable material error, substantive inaccuracy, or injustice to support an ERSB. Accordingly,

given the totality of the circumstances, the Board determined that your request does not merit relief.

It is regretted that the circumstances of your case are such that favorable action cannot be taken. You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new matters, which will require you to complete and submit a new DD Form 149. New matters are those not previously presented to or considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.
