1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that her naval record be corrected to show Petitioner's 4 year term reenlistment contract of 18 November 2022 was cancelled.

2. The Board, consisting of [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 4 April 2023 and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice finds as follows:

a. On 11 June 2013, Petitioner entered active duty.

b. On 31 January 2020, Petitioner reenlisted for 4 years with an End of Active Obligated Service (EAOS) of 30 January 2024. Furthermore, Petitioner received a Zone B SRB.

c. On 18 November 2022, Petitioner reenlisted for 4 years with an EAOS of 17 November 2026.

d. In the advisory opinion, attached as enclosure (2), the office having cognizance over the subject matter addressed in Petitioner's application has commented to the effect that the request has merit and warrants favorable action.

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## CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded that Petitioner received a Zone B SRB for her reenlistment on 31 January 2020. Petitioner subsequently reenlisted on 18 November 2022 for 4 years. Petitioner's SRB precertification was erroneously approved by BUPERS-328 for a Zone B SRB for her 4-year term reenlistment. In accordance with reference (b),<sup>1</sup> a member may receive only one SRB per zone during a career. Petitioner does not currently meet the requirements to reenlist in Zone C for SRB/ESRB. Therefore, the Board determined that Petitioner's reenlistment on 18 November 2022 should be cancelled and her EAOS changed back to 30 January 2024, allowing her to reenlist in Zone C when eligible and be awarded a Zone C SRB/ESRB if available at the time of reenlistment.

## RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

The 4 year immediate reenlistment contract (NAVPERS 1070/601) executed on 18 November 2022, is null and void. Note: This change will reestablish the previous EAOS of 30 January 2024.

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.

5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(e)), and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of the reference, has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.

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<sup>1</sup> Reference (b), additional eligibility criteria will be published by NAVADMIN. If the current SRB NAVADMIN publishes the use of zones, the guidance regarding zones in table 1-1 must be adhered to. A member may receive only one SRB per zone during a career. When reenlisting for SRB, the reenlistment must take the member's new EAOS into the next SRB zone.
