1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to reflect declined participation in the Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP).

2. The Board, consisting of **Construction**, **Construction**, and **Construction**, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 12 April 2023 and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies, to include references (b) and (c).¹

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, found that, before applying to this Board, he exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board made the following findings:

a. Petitioner married on 29 January 2010.

b. Petitioner's had two children, **born on born on and born on born on**

c. On 2 May 2022, Petitioner's spouse signed DD Form 2656, Data for Payment of Retired Personnel before a notary witness concurring with spouse's SBP election and on 3 May 2022, Petitioner signed DD Form 2656, Data for Payment of Retired Personnel, electing to decline SBP coverage.

¹ Reference (b), SBP elections must be made prior to retired pay becoming payable and the election to participate in or decline SBP is irrevocable. If not all requirements for an election needing the spouse's concurrence have been satisfied prior to retirement, for whatever reason, full spouse costs, and coverage will be implemented, regardless of any request by the member to do otherwise. Any change in SBP election subsequent to retirement will be done through an administrative correction of records as permitted by law.

Reference (c), stipulates "The date of the spouse's signature in Block 41c MUST NOT before the date of the member's signature in Block 39c, or on or after the date of retirement listed in Part 1 Section I, Block 4."

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d. Petitioner transferred to the Retired List effective 1 October 2022 and enrolled in SBP Spouse and Children coverage as a result spouse signing DD Form 2656, Data for Payment of Retired Personnel before Petitioner.

e. On 1 March 2023, Petitioner and spouse signed Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) and Reserve Component Survivor Benefit Plan (RCSBP) Open Season Election to Discontinue Participation and submitted the form to Defense Finance and Accounting Services for processing.

f. On 1 April 2023, Petitioner and spouse signed SBP Affidavit before a notary witness requesting to decline SBP coverage.

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded Petitioner provided sufficient evidence to reflect his and spouse's desire to decline SBP coverage prior to transferring to the Retired List. Although Petitioner did not complete the proper administrative requirements, the Board felt that under these circumstances, relief is warranted.

RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner elected to decline participation in SBP with spouse concurrence prior to transferring to the Retired List effective 1 October 2022.

Note: Defense Finance and Accounting Services will complete an audit of Petitioner's pay records to determine the amount of premium refund.

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.

Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(e)), and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of the reference, has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
