1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to show Petitioner's Home of Record (HOR)¹ is [REDACTED] vice [REDACTED].

2. The Board, consisting of [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 9 May 2023 and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:

a. On 22 January 2014, Petitioner signed a Record of Military Processing – Armed Forces of the United States (DD Form 1966). Furthermore, block 4 (Home of Record address) listed [REDACTED].

b. On 24 January 2014, Petitioner signed an Enlistment/Reenlistment Document Armed Forces of the United States (DD Form 4) for 8 years with an expiration of obligated service of

¹ Reference (b), the HOR is the place recorded as the Service member's home when commissioned, appointed, enlisted, inducted, or ordered into a tour of active duty. The place recorded as the Service member's home when reinstated, reappointed, or reenlisted remains the same as that recorded when commissioned, appointed, enlisted, inducted, or ordered into the tour of active duty, unless there is a break in service of more than 1 full day.

23 January 2022. Furthermore, block A3 (Home of Record) listed [REDACTED].

c. Petitioner was released from active duty and transferred to the Naval Reserve with an Honorable character of service and was issued a Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 214) for the period of 10 September 2014 to 8 September 2015 upon completion of required active service. Block 7b (Home of record at time of entry) listed [REDACTED].

d. On 16 January 2020, Petitioner was issued official change duty orders (BUPERS order: 0160) while stationed at NAVOPSPTCEN, [REDACTED] with an effective date of departure of March 2020. Petitioner's ultimate activity was [REDACTED] for duty with an effective date of arrival of 3 April 2020, with a Projected Rotation Date of April 2023.

e. On 31 January 2023, Petitioner signed a command career request (NPPSC 1160/1) requesting a 4 year reenlistment effective 3 March 2023. Petitioner's request was approved on 2 February 2023 by cognizant authority. Petitioner's home of record is listed as [REDACTED].

f. On 3 March 2023, Petitioner reenlisted for 4 years with an End of Active Obligated Service of 2 March 2027. Petitioner's home of record is listed as [REDACTED].

g. On 5 May 2023, Petitioner's Member Data Summary listed his home of record as [REDACTED].

h. In the advisory opinion, attached as enclosure (2), the office having cognizance over the subject matter addressed in Petitioner's application has commented to the effect that the request has merit and warrants partial favorable action.

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following partial corrective action. The Board concluded that Petitioner's DD Form 4, DD Form 1966, and DD Form 214 listed HOR as [REDACTED]. Furthermore, NPPSC 1160/1 lists [REDACTED] as Petitioner's HOR. It is likely that the HOR of [REDACTED] on Petitioner's reenlistment contract is an administrative error, however, there is no documentation in Petitioner's record showing he requested to change his HOR. Therefore, the Board determined that changing Petitioner's HOR to [REDACTED] is appropriate.

RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner's NAVPERS 1070/601 executed on 3 March 2023 listed a home of record [REDACTED] vice [REDACTED].

That part of the Petitioner's request for corrective action that exceeds the foregoing be denied.
