CONCLUSION	
Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. In accordance with reference (b), Petitioner met the criteria to receive two education points, however, the points were not accounted for at the time Petitioner participated in the NWAE. Although the proper administrative requirements were not completed, the Board felt that under these circumstances, relief is warranted.	
RECOMMENDATION	
That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

¹ Reference (b), Sailors competing for advancement to paygrades E4 through E6 will be awarded two points for an accredited Associates degree. Education points will be calculated and credited by the JST. Naval Education and Training Professional Development Center (NETPDC) will receive data from Navy College Management Information System for calculation into the candidates final multiple score. Requests for correction or addition to education points should be submitted to NETPDC and must include a copy of the JST. Additionally, Commanding Officers may request standard score comparison ETP no later than 6 months after the missed exams limiting date.
