1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to reflect history of assignment and foreign service on DD Form 214, Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty ending on 31 August 2017.

2. The Board, consisting of [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 30 May 2023 and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, found that, before applying to this Board, he exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board made the following findings:

a. On 13 March 2002, Petitioner reported to [REDACTED], and departed [REDACTED] on 10 March 2003.

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board finds the existence of an error warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded reference (b)¹ does not authorize listing all of Petitioner's previous duty assignments on the DD Form 214. However,

¹ Reference (b), only the last duty assignment and major command are listed on the DD Form 214. Additionally, the policy directed to enter the years, months, and day of Foreign Service during the period for service performed outside continental United States, except while on deployment.

Petitioner's assignment to [REDACTED] should have been captured in the Foreign Service block of the DD Form 214. Therefore, the Board agreed, under these circumstances, partial relief is warranted.

RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner's DD Form 214, Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty ending on 31 August 2017 is amend to reflect Block 12f (Foreign Service) "00 11 28" vice "00 00 00."
Note: Navy Personnel Command will issue a DD Form 215 or a new DD Form 214 whichever one they deem appropriate.

The part of Petitioner's request for corrective action that exceeds the foregoing is denied in accordance with reference (b).

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.
5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(e)), and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of the reference, has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
