1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to show Petitioner's certificate of release or discharge from active duty (DD Form 214) executed on 3 August 2012 lists block 7a (Place of Entry into Active Duty) and block 7b (Home of Record) as ██████████ vice ██████████ in accordance with Petitioner's Enlistment/Reenlistment Document Armed Forces of the United States (DD Form 4).

2. The Board, consisting of ██████████, ██████████, and ██████████ reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 1 June 2023 and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:

a. On ██████████, Petitioner was born in ██████████), ██████████

b. In accordance with reference (b), the paragraphs below reflect actual items/blocks on the DD Forms 214 and 215. NOTE: It is the responsibility of the signing official to ensure all copies of the DD Form 214 and correction to DD Form 214, certificate of release or discharge from active duty (DD Form 215) are legible. No corrections nor type overs will be made. 7a. Place of Entry into Active Service. Enter city, state, and ZIP code where Marine entered active service. 7b. Home of Record At Time Of Entry (City and State, or complete address if known). Self-explanatory.

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The Marine will be cautioned not to make changes or alterations to the form; to do so will render it void. If the Marine discovers an error after receipt of the form and after departure from the separation activity, or distribution of copies has been made, corrections or changes to blocks 1 through 22 will be made by the activity having physical control of the Officer Qualification Record (OQR)/Service Record Book (SRB). Changes will be made using the DD Form 215.

c. On 26 May 2005, Petitioner graduated from High school in [REDACTED], [REDACTED]

d. On 23 July 2008, Petitioner signed a Record of Military Processing – Armed Forces of the United States (DD Form 1966). Furthermore, block 4 (Home of Record address) listed [REDACTED], and block 14 (Valid Driver’s License) listed [REDACTED]

e. On 24 July 2008, Petitioner got married in [REDACTED] county [REDACTED]

f. On 30 July 2008, Petitioner signed a DD Form 4 for 8 years with an expiration of obligated service of 29 July 2016. Furthermore, block A3 (Home of Record) listed [REDACTED] and block A4 (Place of enlistment/reenlistment) [REDACTED]

g. On 22 June 2012, Petitioner certified his Marine Corps Total Force System Record of Emergency Data which listed his mother residing at [REDACTED]

h. Petitioner was released from active duty and transferred to the Marine Corps Reserve with an Honorable character of service and was issued a DD Form 214 for the period of 4 August 2008 to 3 August 2012 upon completion of required active service. Block 7a (Place of entry into Active Duty) lists [REDACTED] and block 7b (Home of record at time of entry) lists [REDACTED]

## CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded that Petitioner was born in [REDACTED] and his DD Form 1966 and DD Form 4 list his HOR as [REDACTED]. Furthermore, Petitioner’s DD Form 4 lists his place of enlistment/reenlistment as [REDACTED]. However, Petitioner’s DD Form 214 lists the place of enlistment and HOR as [REDACTED] which is his mother’s address.

## RECOMMENDATION.

That Petitioner’s naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner’s DD Form 214 executed on 3 August 2012 listed block 7a (Place of entry into Active Duty) “[REDACTED] vice [REDACTED]” and Block 7b (Home of record at time of entry) listed [REDACTED] vice [REDACTED]. Note: Headquarters, U.S. Marine Corps will issue a DD Form 215 or a new DD Form 214, whichever one they deem appropriate, that reflects the Board’s corrective action.

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A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.

5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(e)), and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of the reference, has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
