

Subj: REVIEW OF NAVAL RECORD OF [REDACTED],
USN, [REDACTED]

e. Service member was discharged with an Honorable characterization of service on 31 December 1945 and was issued a Notice of Separation from U.S. Naval Service (NAVPERS-553).

f. Petitioner contends that service member's birthday was 30 May 1924 and provided a [REDACTED] Delayed Certificate of Birth dated [REDACTED] indicating a date of birth of [REDACTED]. Petitioner requests that service member's discharge certificate be updated to ensure his military grave marker reflects the corrected date.

CONCLUSION

Upon careful review and consideration of all of the evidence of record, the Board determined that Petitioner's request warrants relief.

The Board found that the most recent official document indicating service member's date of birth of [REDACTED] should take precedence.

In view of the above, the Board directs the following corrective action.

RECOMMENDATION

That subject service member be issued a correction to his NAVPERS-533 (DD Form 215) indicating "[REDACTED]" as his date of birth.

That no further changes be made to service member's record.

That a copy of this report of proceedings be filed in service member's naval record.
