CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of the evidence of record and reference (b), the Board determined Petitioner's record warrants relief. As noted previously, Petitioner's DD Form 214 incorrectly lists his most significant duty assignment, his service school dates, and requires correction.

RECOMMENDATION:

In view of the above, the Board directs the following corrective action:

That Petitioner be issued a Correction to DD Form 214, Report of Separation from the Armed Forces of the United States (DD Form 215), for the period ending on 30 June 1956, which indicates Block 28 as and Block 30 as "11-9-53/2-8-54."

A copy of this report of proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
