1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that her naval record be corrected to show Petitioner was reimbursed for her Personally Procured Move (PPM).

2. The Board, consisting of █ reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 26 September 2023 and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:

a. On 6 April 2022, Petitioner was issued a BUPERS mobilization order 0962 (Official Recall to Active Duty) while residing at █ for a period of up to 365 days. Estimated ultimate activity detach date: 7 June 2023.

b. On 8 April 2022, Petitioner transferred from █ █ and arrived to █
█ 2 on 15 May 2022 for duty.

c. On 18 May 2022, Petitioner was issued BUPERS mobilization order modification with an ultimate activity of █ for active duty with an effective date of arrival of 30 October 2021, for a period of up to 365 days. Estimated ultimate activity detach date: 7 June 2023.

d. On 20 May 2022, Petitioner transferred from [REDACTED] and arrived to [REDACTED] on 20 May 2022 for temporary duty.

e. On 21 September 2022, Petitioner transferred from [REDACTED] and arrived to [REDACTED] on 21 September 2022 for duty.

f. On 30 March 2023, U.S. Postal Service issued Petitioner a receipt for 2 priority mail outs with a weight of 36 lbs. and 13.0 oz. and 39 lbs. and .8 oz. for a total of \$264.70.

g. On 3 April 2023, Petitioner was issued BUPERS Demobilization order 0933 (Official release from active duty orders) detaching no later than 14 May 2023.

h. On 12 April 2023, U.S. Postal Service issued Petitioner a receipt for 2 priority mail outs with a weight of 0 lbs. and 11.0 oz. and 38 lbs. and 6.6 oz. for a total of \$173.30.

i. On 18 April 2023, Petitioner was issued Demobilization order modification (Official release from active duty orders) detaching no later than 14 May 2023. Members are entitled to reimbursement for household goods transportation required for the member's personal comfort and wellbeing while on temporary duty for mobilization. Reimbursement is limited to the government weight-based cost per 020501 (table 2-25).

j. On 16 May 2023, Petitioner transferred from [REDACTED], and arrived to [REDACTED] on 16 May 2023 for temporary duty.

k. On 1 September 2023, NAVSUP Fleet Logistics Center [REDACTED] notified Petitioner that Regrettably, 37 pounds and 39 pounds of the postage receipts that were submitted were shipped prior to issuance of orders and is not authorized. The 91 pounds that was processed will remain.

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of reference (b), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following partial corrective action. The Board concluded that per reference (b), household goods allowances are based on when orders are effective and certain criteria must be met in order to execute household goods transportation before an order is issued. The Board concluded that Petitioner's BUPERS mobilization order modification was for a period not to exceed 365 days. Petitioner was approaching the estimated ultimate activity detach date of 7 June 2023. Therefore, Petitioner had reason to believe that demobilization orders would be forthcoming. The Board does not determine the amount Petitioner is entitled to, therefore the Board determined that Petitioner is entitled to reimbursement for the weight shipped up to the maximum weight allowed.

RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner was issued BUPERS Demobilization order 0933 (Official release from active duty orders) on "29 March 2023" vice "3 April 2023".

That part of the Petitioner's request for corrective action that exceeds the foregoing be denied.
