1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected by upgrading his characterization of service consistent with references (b) and (c).

- 2. The Board consisting of particle, and pursuant, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 4 December 2023 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined the corrective action indicated below should be taken. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of Petitioner's application together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of SNS's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies, to include references (b) and (c).
- 3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:
- a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. Although Petitioner's application was not filed in a timely manner, the Board found it in the interest of justice to waive the statute of limitations and consider the case on its merits.
- b. Petitioner enlisted in the Navy and began a period of active duty on 17 August 1955. On 1 December 1958, Petitioner made a statement admitting he was homosexual. On 18 December 1958, he accepted an Other Than Honorable (OTH) discharge for the good of the service and to escape trial by court-martial. On 17 February 1959, Petitioner was discharged with an OTH.

- c. Petitioner argues the sole reason his discharge was classified as OTH was due to his own admission of being homosexual. He is currently hospitalized in a long-term care facility and suffers from dementia.
- d. Reference (c) sets forth the Department of the Defense's current policies, standards, and procedures for correction of military records following the "don't ask, don't tell" (DADT) repeal of 10 U.S.C. 654. It provides service Discharge Review Boards with guidance to grant requests to change the characterization of service to "Honorable," narrative reason for discharge to "Secretarial Authority," SPD code to "JFF," and reenlistment code to "RE-1J," when the original discharge was based solely on DADT or a similar policy in place prior to enactment of it and there are no aggravating factors in the record, such as misconduct.

## CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board concludes Petitioner's request warrants relief.

The Board noted Petitioner was discharged for the good of the service based on his homosexuality, with no aggravating factors in his record. Therefore, the Board found that it was in the interests of justice to change his characterization of service, narrative reason for separation, separation code, and separation authority consistent with the guidance provided in reference (c).

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

In view of the foregoing, the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action.

That Petitioner's character of service be changed to "Honorable," the narrative reason for separation should be changed to "Other good and sufficient reasons (non-derogatory) when determined by proper authority," and the separation authority to "BUPERS MANUAL ARTICLE C-10306, Code 21L."

Petitioner shall be issued a new DD Form 214, Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty and Honorable Discharge Certificate.

That a copy of this report of proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

- 4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.
- 5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulation, Section 723.6(e)), and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing
