1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected by issuing a DD Form 214, Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty for service from 15 August 1984 to 26 January 1988.

2. The Board, consisting of █ reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 14 December 2023 and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, found that, before applying to this Board, he exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board made the following findings:

a. On 13 January 1984, Petitioner enlisted in the Marine Corps Reserve for 6 years of which 4 years was an active duty obligation.

b. On 15 August 1984, Petitioner entered active duty.

c. On 27 January 1988, Petitioner reenlist in Marine Corps for 4 years in pay grade of E-4. Petitioner's official military personnel file does not contain DD Form 214 for active duty service period of 15 August 1984 to 26 January 1988.

d. On 26 January 1992, Petitioner discharged and issued DD Form 214. Petitioner's DD Form 214 reflects active duty service period of 27 January 1988 to 26 January 1992 and total prior active service of 3 years, 5 months, and 12 days.

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded there is no evidence Petitioner was issued DD Form 214 for active duty service of 15 August 1984 to 26 January 1988 in accordance with reference (b),¹ therefore the Board determined that under this circumstance, relief is warranted.

RECOMMENDATION


That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner issued DD Form 214 for the period of 15 August 1984 to 26 January 1988.

A copy of this report of proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
