Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to show that Petitioner was eligible for and received a Selective Retention Bonus (SRB).
- 2. The Board, consisting of ______, and _____ reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 22 February 2024 and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.
- 3. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:
 - a. On 18 September 2017, Petitioner entered active duty.
 - b. On 9 October 2020, Petitioner was assigned ADMOS1 8623.
- c. On 14 May 2021, Petitioner reenlisted for 2 years with an End of Current Contract (ECC) of 13 May 2023.
- d. In accordance with reference (b) (15 June 2022), this MARADMIN announces the SRB program and the Broken Service SRB (BSSRB) program authorized for FY23. With the advent of several new SRB programs, Marines are encouraged to thoroughly review the contents of this bulletin. First term Marines (Zone A) and career Marines (Zone B, C, D, E, F, and G) who reenlist on or after 14 June 2022 are eligible for the FY23 SRB program. This will include any regular component first term or career Marine with an ECC from 1 October 2022 to 30 September 2023.

Zone A applies to those active component Marines with 17 months to 6 years of active military service. Bonus payments are limited to one payment per zone. Zone A lateral move Primary Military Occupational Specialties (PMOS) bonus payments are only authorized for those PMOS(s) designated with Lateral Move (LM). Marines who already hold a PMOS with a LM designator and are in Zone A will rate the PMOS bonus listed below. Zone A PMOS bonus payments for Marines who reenlist for at least 48 months obligated service are authorized as listed below in dollars (bonuses for Marines who reenlist for 36 to 47 months obligated service will be calculated as per para 3.j). Furthermore, a zone "A" SRB for MOS 6694LM, E-3, which is capped at \$36,000 for 48 months of additional obligated service was authorized.

- e. On 25 September 2022, Petitioner's Careerist Active Duty Lateral Move request was submitted requesting to be screened for lateral move 7314/1316 with a reenlistment for 48 months. Headquarters, U.S. Marine Corps approved lateral move into 6694 on 15 February 2023.
- f. In accordance with reference (c) (24 October 2022), this MARADMIN announces changes to MARADMIN 295/22 and remains in effect until 30 September 2023 or otherwise stated. Background. Retaining quality, proven Marines in the right PMOS is critical to meet Fleet Marine Force mission requirements. The emergent Force Design 2030 capabilities and evolving retention environment requires Commanders to be actively involved in retention and lateral move efforts. This FY23 SRB plan will change to meet the developing personnel requirements. Other than the changes outlined in section 3, all authorities directed in reference (A) remain in effect. TFRS MESSAGE A66568, MCO 7220.24P, MCO 1130.808, and DODI 1304.31 contain amplifying information regarding the SRB program.

The following Zone A PMOSs are hereby designated, in addition to those outlined in reference (A), as LM eligible with respective bonuses: "...6694..." Furthermore, Marines in current and historical fast filling PMOSs: 0111, 0331, 1341, 1345, 2131, 2311, 3051, 3152, 3531, and 7041 are highly encouraged to seek lateral move opportunities to continue their Marine Corps service. LM prerequisite waivers will be considered for all proven Marines who request a LM. Marines should contact their unit career planner for more information on the LM process and all PMOSs eligible for LM.

- g. On 21 February 2023, Petitioner was assigned ADMOS1 0311.
- h. On 22 February 2023, Petitioner reenlisted for 4 years with an ECC of 21 February 2027. "I understand that this reenlistment contract is contingent upon successful completion of the training requirements for MOS 6694. Should I fail to complete the training requirements for MOS 6694, I may be reverted to my previous MOS or separated from the Marine Corps."
 - i. On 1 April 2023, Petitioner was promoted to Corporal/E-4.
 - j. On 21 November 2023, Petitioner was assigned PMOS 6694.
- k. In the advisory opinion, attached as enclosure (2), the office having cognizance over the subject matter addressed in Petitioner's application has commented to the effect that the request has merit and warrants favorable action.

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CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded that Petitioner first submitted for lateral move into PMOS 7314 or 1316 on 25 September 2022. He was ultimately approved for PMOS 6694 on 15 February 2023. Petitioner executed a 48-month reenlistment on 22 February 2023. At the time of reenlistment, reference (c) authorized a Zone A SRB for 6694/LM. The Board determined that due to administrative oversight, Petitioner was not paid the SRB.

RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Paragraph B8b (Remarks) of the enlistment/reenlistment document (DD Form 4) executed on 22 February 2023 for a term of 4 years, listed "REENLISTED THIS DATE FOR THE FOLLOWING INCENTIVE: PMOS 6694LM ZONE A SRBP \$36,000." I UNDERSTAND THAT THIS REENLISTMENT CONTRACT IS CONTINGENT UPON SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF THE TRAINING REQUIREMENTS FOR MOS 6694. SHOULD I FAIL TO COMPLETE THE TRAINING REQUIREMENTS FOR MOS 6694, I MAY BE REVERTED TO MY PREVIOUS MOS OR SEPARATED FROM THE MARINE CORPS.

Note: This change upon completion of MOS training will entitle the member to a Zone "A" SRB for MOS 6694LM, E3, which is capped at \$36,000 for 48 months of additional obligated service. Remaining obligated service to 13 May 2023 will be deducted from SRB computation.

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

- 4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.
- 5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(e)), and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of the reference, has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
