1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to cancel operative/non-operative extension and show that Petitioner reenlisted on 20 April 2022 for 4 years and was eligible for and received a Zone B Selective Reenlistment Bonus (SRB), and was eligible to transfer his education benefits.

2. The Board, consisting of **Construction**, **Construction**, and **Construction** reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 6 February 2024 and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice finds as follows:

a. On 9 December 2015, Petitioner entered active duty for 4 years with an End of Active Obligated Service (EAOS) of 8 December 2019 and Soft EAOS (SEAOS) of 8 December 2021; "Training in the Nuclear Field. MILPERSMAN 1530-030 and MILPERSMAN 1306-500, 1306-502. and 1306-504 (NF) are governing directives. Advancement to rate and grade per MILPERSMAN 1430-010. I understand that this extension of active service becomes binding upon execution, and thereafter may not be cancelled. Except as set forth in MILPERSMAN 1160-040 and 1510-030. In particular, I understand that when I accept advancement to E4, 12

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months of this agreement may not be cancelled whether or not I complete nuclear power or advanced training."

b. On 29 January 2018, Petitioner transferred from **19**, and arrived to on 29 January 2018 for duty.

c. On 20 December 2018, Petitioner reenlisted for 6 years with an EAOS of 19 December 2024 and received a Zone A SRB.

d. In accordance with reference (b), this NAVADMIN announced revised SRB policy for Active Component and Full Time Support, superseding NAVADMIN 272/19. Sailors must now have reenlisted within 365 days of their EAOS (as opposed to 270 days required in NAVADMIN 272/19), except in the case of Nuclear-trained Sailors who could have reenlisted at any point in the reenlistment zone, per guidance in OPNAVINST 1160.8B.

e. In August 2020, Petitioner was awarded Navy Enlisted Classification (NEC) N25S.

f. On 9 January 2021, Petitioner got married. On 5 June 2021, Petitioner's first child was born.

g. In accordance with reference (c), FY21 SRB Award Plan (N13SRB 005/FY21), a Zone "B" SRB with an award level of 7.5 (\$100,000 award ceiling) for the MMN(SW)/N25O/S rate/NEC was listed.

h. On 16 August 2021, Petitioner was issued official change duty orders (BUPERS order: ) with required obligated service to April 2025, while stationed in

with an effective date of departure of January 2022. Petitioner's intermediate (01) activity was a second second for temporary duty under instruction with an effective date of arrival of 7 February 2022. Petitioner's ultimate activity was for duty with an effective date of arrival of 30 April 2022 with a Projected Rotation Date of April 2025. Obligated service to April 2025 is required for this assignment which may be satisfied by reenlistment or extension of enlistment. Circumstances such as potential monetary loss under critical skills bonus or SRB, refer to MILPERSMAN 1306-106 para 4. Use of NAVPERS 1070/613 only authorized for SRB eligible sailors.

i. On 1 December 2021, Navy Standard Integrated Personnel System (NSIPS)/Electronic Service Record (ESR) shows a 4-month agreement to extend enlistment with an SEAOS of 19 April 2025.

j. On 9 December 2021, Petitioner entered Zone B.

k. On 12 January 2022, Petitioner transferred from **Example 1**, and arrived to **Example 2** on 8 February 2022 for temporary duty.

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l. In accordance with reference (d), FY22 SRB Award Plan (N13SRB 001/FY22), a Zone "B" SRB with an award level of 8.5 (\$100,000 award ceiling) for the MMN(SW)/N25O/S rate/NEC was listed.

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m. On 29 April 2022, Petitioner transferred from a second private and arrived on 29 April 2022 for duty.

n. In July 2022, Petitioner was awarded NEC 805A.

o. On 18 November 2023, Petitioner's second child was born.

p. On 1 February 2024, Petitioner's Benefits for Education Administrative Service Tool listed a request date of 5 January 2024 and rejected on 8 January 2024.

## CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded that on 16 August 2021, Petitioner was issued BUPERS order: with required obligated service to April 2025. At that time, a Zone B SRB was authorized in accordance with reference (c), however Petitioner was still in Zone A. On 1 December 2021, NSIPS/ESR shows a 4-month agreement to extend enlistment to meet the OBLISERV. On 9 December 2021, Petitioner entered Zone B. The Board determined that Petitioner should have signed a NAVPERS 1070/613 vice extension of enlistment. On 20 April 2022, Petitioner would have been eligible to reenlist for 4 years and receive a Zone B SRB. Furthermore, Petitioner is eligible to transfer his education benefits to his dependents.

## RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner's 4-month agreement to extend enlistment (NAVPERS 1070/621) operative on 20 December 2024 is null and void.

Petitioner executed an Administrative Remarks (NAVPERS 1070/613) on 1 December 2021 agreeing to extend enlistment for 4 months for OBLISERV to April 2025.

Petitioner was discharged 19 April 2022 and reenlisted on 20 April 2022 for a term of 4 years.

Note: This change will entitle Petitioner to a Zone "B" SRB with an award level of "8.5" (\$100,000 award ceiling) for the MMN(SW)/N25S rating/NEC. Remaining obligated service to 19 December 2024 will be deducted from SRB computation. Additionally, Navy Personnel Command is authorized to align transfer of education benefits with the 20 April 2022 reenlistment. Furthermore, that any other entries affected by the Board's recommendation be corrected.

## Subj: REVIEW OF NAVAL RECORD ICO , USN, XXX-XX-The Board for Correction of Naval Records (BCNR) will <u>not</u> take any action with the Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) for the SRB payment. Petitioner's SRB payment will <u>not</u> be funded by the BCNR's Claims Line of Accounting (LOA). at N133D has secured funding via unexecuted SRB funds and will use their LOA to pay the SRB payment, and will coordinate directly with the DFAS to determine Petitioner's incentive. Contact the Assistant Nuclear Enlisted Program Manager, N133D, concerning SRB payment.

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.
