1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that her naval record be corrected to change home of record (HOR) from Rochester, NY to Memphis, TN.

2. The Board, consisting of █ reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 23 January 2024 and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, found that, before applying to this Board, he exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board made the following findings:

a. The HOR is the place recorded as the Service member's home when commissioned, appointed, enlisted, inducted, or ordered into a tour of active duty. A member may only change the HOR if a break in service exceeds one full day (more than 24 hours). However, a correction to the HOR may be authorized in those instances when, through a bona fide error, the place originally named at the time of current entry in the Service was not in fact the actual home.

b. On 28 March 2014, Petitioner enlisted in the Naval Reserve for 8-years of which 4-years was an active duty obligation. Petitioner's DD Form 4, Enlistment/Reenlistment Document listed Item 3 (Home of Record) as █ and Item 4 (Place of Enlistment/Reenlistment) listed as █

c. On 3 June 2014, Petitioner entered active duty. Petitioner's DD Form 1966, Record of Military Processing reflects Item 3 (Current Address) [REDACTED] and Item 4 (Home of Record Address) "Same as Item 3."

d. In the advisory opinion, attached as enclosure (2), the office having cognizance over the subject matter addressed in Petitioner's application has commented to the effect that the request has merit and warrants favorable action.

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded that Petitioner's HOR was [REDACTED] at the time of enlistment. The HOR on Petitioner's DD Form 1966, Record of Military Processing should not have been amended to reflect her current address at the time of entry into active duty in accordance with reference (b). Therefore, the Board determined that under this circumstance, relief is warranted.

RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner's DD Form 1966, Record of Military Processing is amended to reflect Item 4 (Home of Record Address) [REDACTED] vice "Same as Item 3 [REDACTED] Note: Furthermore, that any other required updates affected by the Board's recommendation be corrected.

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.

5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(e)), and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of the reference, has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
