the United States (DD Form 214), under block 28, to reflect his “most significant duty assignment.”

e. Petitioner contends that he was never stationed in [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and that “[REDACTED]” was erroneously entered into his discharge record when it should have reflected his correct, most significant, duty station of [REDACTED], [REDACTED]. He would like this information corrected to provide his family with an accurate record of his service history.

CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board concluded that Petitioner’s request warrants relief. The Board found no evidence in Petitioner’s service record related to [REDACTED], [REDACTED], whereas the Board observed clear documentation that he served a majority of his enlistment at [REDACTED], [REDACTED]. The Board concluded that the entry in Petitioner’s record constitutes plain error and warrants correction. Accordingly, the Board determined that it is in the interest of justice to grant the requested relief.

In view of the foregoing, the Board finds the existence of an error warranting the following corrective action.

RECOMMENDATION:

That Petitioner be issued a Correction to Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 215) indicating in block 28 that his most significant duty assignment was “[REDACTED].”

That no further changes be made to Petitioner’s record.

A copy of this report of proceedings be filed in Petitioner’s naval record.
