(2) Case summary

- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Petitioner filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting an adjustment to his discharge documents to change his social security number (SSN). Enclosure (2) applies.
- 2. The Board, consisting of reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 9 February 2024, and pursuant to its regulations, determined the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of his naval service records, and applicable statutes, regulations, policies.
- 3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:
- a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.
- b. Although enclosure (1) was not filed in a timely manner, it is in the interest of justice to review the application on its merits.
- c. Petitioner enlisted in the Naval Reserves and completed an Honorable period of active service from 15 September 1992 to 24 February 1993. Upon his discharge, Petitioner was issued a Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 214). Block 3, annotates his SSN as
- d. Petitioner request adjustment of the SSN listed on his discharge documents to reflect his current legal SSN. Petitioner provided documents from the Social Security Administration (SSA) which indicates Petitioners SSN was changed due to fraud issues. The SSA notes Petitioner's SSN was changed to

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CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of the evidence of record and reference (b), the Board determined Petitioner provided sufficient legal documentation to reflect that his SSN has been changed from the SSN that he used throughout his service in the Navy.

As a result of the foregoing, the Board recommends change of the SSN listed on Petitioner's separation documents from his listed SSN to his newly issued SSN.

RECOMMENDATION:

In view of the above, the Board directs the following corrective action:

That Petitioner be issued a Correction to DD Form 214, Report of Separation from the Armed Forces of the United States (DD Form 215), for the period ending on 24 February 1993, to indicate Petitioner's SSN as

That Petitioner be issued a new NAVPERS 1070 to indicate his SSN as



A copy of this report of proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
