1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to show Petitioner was reimbursed for his Personally Procured Move (PPM).

2. The Board, consisting of **Sector** reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 19 December 2023 and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:

a. On 3 April 2023, Petitioner signed an **Example 1** with a Pack date of 26 April 2023 and Delivery date of 5 May 2023.

b. On 10 May 2023, **Sector and Sector and Se**

c. On 13 June 2023, Petitioner was issued official separation orders (BUPERS Order: 1643) while stationed in **September** 2023. Petitioner's place elected for travel was **September** with an effective date of 13 November 2023.

d. Petitioner was released from active duty and transferred to the Naval Reserve with an honorable character of service and was issued a Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active

Duty (DD Form 214) for the period of 14 December 2017 to 13 November 2023 upon completion of required active service.

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded that per reference (b), household goods allowances are based on when orders are effective and certain criteria must be met in order to execute household goods transportation before an order is issued. Petitioner was preparing to separate upon completion of required active service; therefore, Petitioner had reason to believe that official separation orders would be forthcoming.

RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner's official separation orders (BUPERS Order: 1643) were issued on "20 April 2023" vice "13 June 2023."

A copy of this report of proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
