- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting removal of the initial 29 October 2021 rebuttal to the Administrative Remarks (Page 11) entry at enclosure (2).
- 2. The Board, consisting of particles allegations of error and injustice on 25 January 2024, and pursuant to its regulations, determined the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval records, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.
- 3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, found as follows:
- a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulation within the Department of the Navy.
- b. Petitioner was issued enclosure (2), an Administrative Remarks (Page 11) counseling entry, on 29 October 2021, stating he had been assigned to the substandard performance program due to a production level below the Marine Corps Recruiting Command average. In response, he submitted the lengthy rebuttal dated 29 October 2021 at enclosure (3).
- c. On 8 January 2024, Petitioner submitted a revised rebuttal which was also added to his Official Military Personnel File (OMPF). See enclosure (4)
- d. Petitioner requested the Board remove the initial rebuttal at enclosure (3) because he contends that it is too long and "does not give off the sense of accountability [he wishes] to display to the promotion board."

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence, the Board determined Petitioner's request warrants relief. The Board determined it was in the interest of justice to allow Petitioner to remove enclosure (3) from his OMPF.

RECOMMENDATION

In view of the above, the Board recommends the following corrective action.

Petitioner's naval record be corrected by removing enclosure (3), the 29 October 2021 rebuttal to the Administrative Remarks (Page 11) entry of 29 October 2021.
