APPLICANT'S REQUEST

Her Home of Record (HOR) be corrected to reflect Work-Prod... instead of Work-Product

APPLICANT'S CONTENTIONS

Her HOR and her state residence is work-Prod....... While staying temporarily in work-Product, she made the decision to enlist in the Air Force. Her recruiter just asked for the address of where she had been staying without clarifying that it would show up as her HOR. Her driver's license was issued in work-Prod....; her vehicle is registered in work-Prod....; and she claims/pays taxes to the State of work-Prod.....

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The applicant is an Air Force senior airman (E-4).

On 28 Jan 20, according to DD Form 4, *Enlistment/Reenlistment Document – Armed Forces of the United States*, the applicant enlisted in the Regular Air Force. Section 3, *Home of Record*, reflects Brooklyn, *Work-Product*.

APPLICABLE AUTHORITY/GUIDANCE

The Joint Travel Regulations (JTR), Appendix A, defines the HOR as the place recorded as the individual's home when appointed, commissioned, enlisted, inducted, or ordered into a tour of active duty. The JTR further states that a member may only change the HOR if a break in service exceeds one full day. Additionally, in instances of a bona fide error where the place originally named at the time of current entry into the service was not in fact the actual home, the correction must be fully justified and the home, as corrected, must be the member's actual home upon entering the service, and not a different place selected for the member's convenience.

According to the Air Force Personnel Center myPers website, state residency is the home for the purposes of taxes as a member moves throughout their military career. While the state residence may be updated at any time by completing a DD Form 2058, *State of Legal Residence Certificate*, at the Military Personnel Flight (MPF), the HOR remains unchanged unless there is a break in service of at least one day.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSION

- 1. The application was timely filed.
- 2. The applicant exhausted all available non-judicial relief before applying to the Board.
- 3. After a careful review of the applicant's contentions and the available evidence of record, the Board is not convinced the applicant has provided sufficient evidence to conclude she is the victim of an error or injustice. The HOR when the applicant entered active duty on 28 Jan 20, is listed as *Work-Product*, and the applicant did not provide evidence that her HOR was recorded in error. In addition, although the applicant believes *work-Product* is her HOR because it is her residency for tax purposes, as noted above, the state residence may be updated at any time by completing DD Form 2058 at the MPF. However, the HOR remains unchanged unless there is a break in service of at least one day. The applicant did not have a break in service of more than one full day; therefore, a change to her HOR is not warranted. In view of the foregoing, the Board recommends against correcting the applicant's records.

RECOMMENDATION

The Board recommends informing the applicant the evidence did not demonstrate material error or injustice, and the Board will reconsider the application only upon receipt of relevant evidence not already presented.
