APPLICANT'S REQUEST

His Home of Record (HOR) be corrected to reflect Work-Product instead of Work-Prod...

APPLICANT'S CONTENTIONS

At the time of his enlistment, he was living in Work-Product and was told by his initial recruiter he would be better off flying to Work-Prod... to "start the process" since that is where his expected "joint spouse" assignment would take him. The recruiter used the address of his spouse, because that would be the address where he would live once he enlisted so it needed to be listed as his HOR. He only did so because he did not know the difference at the time and the future role it would play.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The applicant is an Air Force senior airman (E-4).

On 11 Sep 20, according to DD Form 4, *Enlistment/Reenlistment Document – Armed Forces of the United States*, the applicant enlisted in Air Force Reserve, Delayed Entry/Enlistment Program. Section 3, *Home of Record*, reflects Belleville, St. Clair, Work-Prod... Section F, *Discharge From/Delayed Entry/Enlistment Program*, reflects he was discharged on 23 Nov 20, and on that same date, Section H, *Confirmation of Enlistment or Reenlistment*, reflects he enlisted in the Regular Air Force.

On 23 Nov 20, according to DD Form 1966, *Record of Military Processing – Armed Forces of the United States*, Block 4, *Home of Record Address*, reflects Work-Product, Work-Prod...

APPLICABLE AUTHORITY/GUIDANCE

The Joint Travel Regulations (JTR), Appendix A, defines the HOR as the place recorded as the individual's home when appointed, commissioned, enlisted, inducted, or ordered into a tour of active duty. The JTR further states that a member may only change the HOR if a break in service exceeds one full day. Additionally, in instances of a bona fide error where the place originally named at the time of current entry into the service was not in fact the actual home, the correction

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must be fully justified and the home, as corrected, must be the member's actual home upon entering the service, and not a different place selected for the member's convenience.

According to the Air Force Personnel Center myPers website, state residency is the home for the purposes of taxes as a member moves throughout their military career. While the state residence may be updated at any time by completing a DD Form 2058, *State of Legal Residence Certificate*, at the Military Personnel Flight (MPF), the HOR remains unchanged unless there is a break in service of at least one day.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSION

1. The application was timely filed.
2. The applicant exhausted all available non-judicial relief before applying to the Board.
3. After a careful review of the applicant's contentions and the available evidence of record, the Board is not convinced the applicant has provided sufficient evidence to conclude he is the victim of an error or injustice. The HOR when the applicant entered active duty on 23 Nov 20, is listed as [Work-Prod...], and the applicant did not provide evidence that his HOR was recorded in error. Although the state residence may be updated at any time by completing DD Form 2058 at the MPF, however, the HOR remains unchanged unless there is a break in service of at least one day. The applicant did not have a break in service of more than one full day; therefore, a change to his HOR is not warranted. In view of the foregoing, the Board recommends against correcting the applicant's records.

RECOMMENDATION

The Board recommends informing the applicant the evidence did not demonstrate material error or injustice, and the Board will reconsider the application only upon receipt of relevant evidence not already presented.
