### APPLICANT'S REQUEST

Her time served on the Individual Ready Reserve (IRR) be reflected on her DD Form 214, *Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty*.

### APPLICANT'S CONTENTIONS

Her contract was for four years of which she only served two years and five months. She was not placed in the Inactive Ready Reserve and under the Reserve Obligation Term Date "N/A" was entered. She is asking for this correction since she did not complete her initial service obligation. Further, after her discharge from the Air Force, she joined the Army National Guard and was placed on Title 32 (active duty).

The applicant's complete submission is at Exhibit A.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS

The applicant is an honorably discharged Air Force airman (E-2).

On 14 January 1998, according to DD Form 214, *Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty*, the applicant entered active duty. On 14 June 2000, the applicant was honorably discharged from active duty. She served 2 years, 5 months and 1-day total active service and was credited with 5 months and 8 days total prior inactive service. Her narrative reason for separation reflects "Pregnancy or Childbirth."

## AIR FORCE EVALUATION

AFPC/DPMSSR recommends denying the application. A review of the applicant's Master Personnel Record (MPR) revealed the applicant was still serving under Article 15 UCMJ punishment which was not set to expire until September 2000. Negative quality indicators preclude entry into the IRR; therefore, personnel are discharged from the Air Force and any remaining obligated service is waived. Based on the applicant's request and the MPR, there is no error or injustice with the discharge processing or the preparation of the DD Form 214.

## APPLICANT'S REVIEW OF AIR FORCE EVALUATION

The Board sent a copy of the advisory opinion to the applicant on 3 June 2024 for comment (Exhibit D), but has received no response.

## FINDINGS AND CONCLUSION

1. The application was not timely filed. The Board also notes the applicant did not file the application within three years of discovering the alleged error or injustice, as required by Section 1552 of Title 10, United States Code, and Department of the Air Force Instruction 36-2603, *Air Force Board for Correction of Military Records (AFBCMR)*. While the applicant asserts a date of discovery within the three-year limit, the Board does not find the assertion supported by a preponderance of the evidence. The Board does not find it in the interest of justice to waive the three-year filing requirement.
2. The applicant exhausted all other available administrative remedies before applying to the Board.
3. After reviewing all Exhibits, the Board concludes the applicant is not the victim of an error or injustice. The Board concurs with the rationale and recommendation of AFPC/DPMSSR and finds a preponderance of the evidence does not substantiate the applicant's contentions. The Board finds no evidence of an injustice or error in the applicant's discharge to warrant granting relief. Therefore, the Board recommends against correcting the applicant's records.
4. The applicant has not shown a personal appearance, with or without counsel, would materially add to the Board's understanding of the issues involved.

## RECOMMENDATION

The Board recommends informing the applicant the evidence did not demonstrate material error or injustice, and the Board will reconsider the application only upon receipt of relevant evidence not already presented.
