STATEMENT OF FACTS

The applicant is an Air Force senior airman (E-4).

On 13 Mar 19, according to her DD Form 4, *Enlistment/Reenlistment Document – Armed Forces of the United States*, the applicant enlisted in the Delayed Entry Program and reflects she will enlist in the Regular Air Force by 11 Mar 20. Section 3, *Home of Record*, reflects Further, on 14 May 19, it reflects she enlisted in the Regular Air Force in the grade of E-2.

On 24 Nov 14, according to her DD Form 1966/1, Record of Military Processing – Armed Forces of the United States, Section 4, Home of Record Address, reflects we...

APPLICABLE AUTHORITY/GUIDANCE

The Joint Travel Regulations (JTR), 1 Jan 22, Appendix A, page A-11. **HOME OF RECORD** is the place recorded as the Service member's home when commissioned, appointed, enlisted, inducted, or ordered to active duty. If there is a break in service of more than one full day, then the Service member may change the home of record. If there is a break in service of less than one full day, then the Service member may not change the home of record. A Service member may correct the home of record if, through a bona fide error, the place originally named at the time of entry into the Service was not the actual home. The correction must be justified, and the corrected home of record must be the Service member's actual home upon entering the Service, not a different place selected for the Service member's convenience.

DD Form 214 Personnel Services Delivery Guide, Section E, Table 5, Block 7b, the HOR on the application for appointment (AF Form 24, Application for Appointment as Reserve of the Air Force or USAF without Component) is used as the HOR on the DD Form 214 for active duty officers. As a secondary source, the HOR listed on the EAD order for the starting period of service recorded on the DD Form 214, block 12a (Date Entered Active Duty this Period), may be used.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSION


- 1. The application was timely filed.
- 2. The applicant exhausted all available non-judicial relief before applying to the Board.
- 3. After reviewing all Exhibits, the Board concludes the applicant is not the victim of an error or injustice. The Board finds a preponderance of the evidence does not substantiate the applicant's contentions. The Board determines that she has provided no evidence that her home or record, or her place of entry were incorrectly recorded at the time she initially came on active duty. In absence of evidence to the contrary, the Board finds no basis to recommend granting relief. Therefore, the Board recommends against correcting the applicant's records.

RECOMMENDATION

The Board recommends informing the applicant the evidence did not demonstrate material error or injustice, and the Board will reconsider the application only upon receipt of relevant evidence not already presented.

CERTIFICATION
