APPLICANT REQUESTS: in effect, correction of her records to show the submitted DA Forms 1380 (Record of Individual Performance of Reserve Duty Training) for September and October 2020 were accepted and added to her record.

FACTS:

1. The applicant states:

a. She is requesting correction to her Army Reserves point records for 2020. She is due five points for completion of required training outside of Battle Assembly. Those five points will result in a good year toward retirement.

b. On 10 October 2020, she completed PALS Certification at Emergency Response Training and Support Services in Columbus, MS. This is an Area of Concentration (AOC) 62A requirement. The course was 8 hours long. A DA Form 1380 for points only was returned without action due to submission after 60 days with the guidance to submit to the Army Review Boards Agency (ARBA).

c. On 22 October 2020, she completed the ACLS Certification at Emergency Response Training and Support Services in Columbus, MS. This is also an AOC 62A requirement. The course was 8 hours long. A DA Form 1380 for points only was returned without action due to submission after 60 days with the guidance to submit to

ARBA. These activities are authorized for points according to Rule 8 – Attends authorized conventions, professional conferences, or appropriate trade association meetings in a non-pay status. Similarly, a point for flu vaccination outside of drill was not awarded.

2. A review of the applicant's military record shows the following:

a. Having had prior service in the U.S. Army Reserve (USAR) and Regular Army, Orders Number A-03-706454 published by the U.S. Army Human Resources Command, St. Louis, MO, ordered the applicant to active duty to fulfill her 5-year active Army requirement with a report date of 11 June 2007.

b. On 13 June 2007, DA Form 71 (Oath of Office - Military Personnel) shows she was appointed as a Regular Army Medical Corps officer and executed an oath of office.

c. On 25 April 2017, she was honorably released from active duty and transferred to her USAR unit. DD Form 214 (Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty) shows she completed 9 years, 10 months, and 15 days net active service this period.

d. DA Form 5016 (Retirement Accounting Statement) dated 29 July 2023, shows in pertinent part, she earned the following retirement points during the period of 30 June 2020 to 29 June 2021:

- 30 – Inactive Duty Training (IDT) points
- 15 – membership points
- 45 – earned points
- 45 – creditable points
- no years, months, or days qualifying for retirement

e. DA Form 5016 (Chronological Statement of Retirement Points) dated 17 November 2023, shows in pertinent part:

(1) She earned the following retirement points during the period of 30 June 2020 to 29 June 2021:

- 30 – IDT points
- 15 – membership points
- 45 – total points creditable
- no years, months, or days qualifying for retirement

(2) A total of:

- 285 – IDT points





REFERENCES:

1. AR 140-1 (Mission, Organization, and Training) states in paragraph 3-26 (Training of Soldiers in a non-pay status), Soldiers in an active status may take part in individual inactive duty training (IDT) in a non-pay status when authorized by the appropriate commander. In pertinent part, individual training opportunities with retirement point credit are approved for:

- attachment to appropriate Reserve Component TPUs
- attachment to Active Army units
- attachment to reinforcement training units as appropriate
- participation in approved training projects or using administrative skills in support of TPU and USAR activities
- attendance at Army service or Army area school training
- enrollment in appropriate extension courses
- attendance at authorized conventions, professional conferences, or appropriate trade association meetings related to the individual's mobilization specialty
- conducting or reviewing medical examinations, and related medical duties
- recruiting duties as described in AR 140–185

2. AR 140-185 (Training and Retirement Point Credits and Unit Level Strength Accounting Records), paragraph 2-1 (Criteria for crediting retirement points) states, IDT will be either 4 hours in length for one retirement point or 8 hours in length for two retirement points.
