<u>APPLICANT REQUESTS:</u> correction of his retirement points to reflect inclusion of service for points only performed for the retirement period covering October 2022.

FACTS:

1. The applicant states, in pertinent part, the retirement points for October 2022 need to be added to his service record. At the time, the Integrated Personnel and Pay System – Army (IPPS-A) was down due to a "brownout" where they conducted changes to the system and could not complete, he was not able to submit any dates prior to 14 November 2022.

2. On 14 August 2003, he enlisted in the U.S. Army Reserve (USAR) for a period of 8 years.

3. On 19 October 2004, he enlisted in the Regular Army for a period of 5 years.

4. On 17 September 2007, Headquarters, Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield issued Orders Number 260-520 reassigning him to the U.S. Army Transition Point for transition processing and honorable release from active duty, effective 20 December 2007, and assignment to the USAR Control Group (Reinforcement) with a terminal date of Reserve obligation of 17 June 2012.

5. His DD Form 214 (Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty) reflects an honorable release from active duty for completion of required active service and transfer to the USAR Control Group (Reinforcement) on 20 December 2007. Item 12 (Record of Service shows service shows he completed 3 years, 3 months, and 20 days.

6. On 12 February 2014, he enlisted in the USAR for a period of 3 years.

7. On 10 April 2018 he reenlisted in the USAR for a period of 6 years.

8. DA Forms 1380, dated 31 October 2022, show the applicant completed training on 1-21 and 24-27 October 2022, for 4 hours each, totaling 24 total retirement points.

9. A Memorandum, Subject: Letter of Lateness for DA Form 1380 Points Only, dated 9 November 2022, states the DA Form 1380 was a late submission due to Soldier unavailability for timely submission.

10. On 22 June 2023, he reenlisted in the USAR for an indefinite term.

11. A DA Form 5016 (Retirement Accounting Statement), dated 12 September 2023, shows for the retirement year ending 13 November 2022, the applicant earned 8 Inactive Duty Training (IDT) points, 4 membership points, and 48 active duty points, totaling 60 total points creditable.

12. He continues service with the USAR.

13. On 11 October 2023, the United States Army Reserve Command (USARC), Chief, Soldier Programs Branch, provided a response to the request for an advisory opinion of the applicant's request stating, in effect, they reviewed the applicant's documents and determined he should be awarded 24 points in accordance with Army Regulation (AR) 140-185 (Army Reserve Training and Retirement Point Credits and Unit Level Strength Accounting Records).

5. On 19 October 2023, the applicant was provided with a copy of the advisory opinion to provide a response. As of 2 November 2023, he did not respond.

BOARD DISCUSSION:

1. After reviewing the application, all supporting documents, and the evidence found within the military record, the Board found that relief was warranted. The applicant's contentions, the military record, and regulatory guidance were carefully considered.

2. The Board concurred with the advisory opinion, and determined the applicant's record should be corrected to add an additional 24 retirement points.

BOARD DETERMINATION/RECOMMENDATION:

The Board determined the evidence presented is sufficient to warrant a recommendation for relief. As a result, the Board recommends that all Department of the Army records of the individual concerned be corrected by:

a. showing his DA Forms 1380, dated 31 October 2022, were timely submitted, received and processed by the Army Human Resources Command, and

b. crediting the applicant with the completion of 24 (non-paid) retirement points, based on the entries in his DA Forms 1380, dated 31 October 2022.

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REFERENCE:

Army Regulation 140-185 (Training and Retirement Point Credits and Unit Level Strength Accounting Records), paragraph 3-3 (DA Form 1380) provides that the DA Form 1380 is utilized to record IDT performed by non-unit Soldiers under the jurisdiction of HRC who are attached for retirement points only to USAR Troop Program Units, Army National Guard units, or to another service or component for training. Only attached Soldiers are authorized to perform IDT with the exception of one annual physical health assessment each for medical and dental readiness when authorized by the command prior to the event. Non-unit Soldiers attached for retirement point credit to IMA detachments are reported on DA Form 1379 (U.S. Army Reserve Components Unit Record of Reserve Training) for those units.

a. Nonpaid DA Forms 1380 will not be entered into ADARS and will be forwarded to HRC for award of retirement points no later than the end of each duty month.

b. With regard to awarding of retirement points for IDT (Four-Hour Rule), Service Members will be awarded one point for each 4-hour period of IDT duty performed. Maximum of two points per calendar day applies to IDT duty. Duty must be 8 hours in duration to receive two points per day.
