APPLICANT REQUESTS: retirement point credit for duties performed during January 2023 and July 2023 as a member of a troop program unit of the U.S. Army Reserve (USAR).

APPLICANT'S SUPPORTING DOCUMENT(S) CONSIDERED BY THE BOARD:

- DD Form 149 (Application for Correction of Military Record)
- Two DA Forms 1380 (Record of Individual Performance of Reserve Duty Training) for January 2023 and July 2023

FACTS:

1. The applicant states her DA Form 5016 (Retirement Accounting Statement) is missing retirement points for January and July Battle Assembly. She was informed that the Readiness Division can only execute from 60 days from signature and 1 year back in IPPS-A. All other requests must be sent to Army Review Boards Agency (ARBA) via their online portal using DD Form 149. She signed the sign-in sheet during battle assembly. However, she was not aware that a DA Form 1380 needed to be submitted as well. She is currently 30% disabled and drills for points. Once she learned that the DA Form 1380 is also needed, she submitted the form.

2. The applicant enlisted in the Regular Army on 16 February 2016. She was honorably released from active duty on 13 September 2019 after completing 3 years, 6 months, and 28 days of active service.

4. She served in the New York Army National Guard (ARNG) beginning on 14 September 2019, and she was honorably separated from the ARNG on 13 September 2020 and transferred to the U.S. Army Reserve Control Group (Individual Ready Reserve). Her NGB Form 22 (Report of Separation and Record of Service) show she completed 1 year of ARNG service.

5. She was ordered to active duty (from the USAR) from 28 March to 21 August 2020, completing 4 months and 24 days of active service.

6. She executed a 1 year extension in the USAR on 28 January 2023.

7. The applicant's current Retirement Accounting Statement shows she has completed 5 qualifying years of service towards non-regular retirement. A breakdown of her retirement points is as follows:

8. She submitted two DA Forms 1380, both dated 30 October 2023, as follows:

- DA Form 1380 for "other" duties performed on 7 January 2023, for points only. This form was signed on 30 October 2023
- DA Form 1380 for "other" duties performed on 16 and 17 July 2023 for points only. This form is signed on 30 October 2023

9. The U.S. Army Reserve Command (USARC) provided an advisory opinion on 31 January 2024 in the processing of this case. A USARC advisory official states USARC reviewed the applicant's documents and determined they should be awarded six (6) retirement points in accordance with Army Regulation (AR) 140-185, Training and Retirement Points Credits and Unit Level Strength Accounting Records. The retirement points were not awarded when the duty was performed because the Soldier did not know to fill out the DA Form 1380. When the form was completed and submitted, it was outside the window for the Readiness Division to update. Full administrative relief is recommended.

10. The applicant was provided with a copy of this advisory opinion to give her an opportunity to submit comments.

### BOARD DISCUSSION:

After reviewing the application, all supporting documents, and the evidence found within the military record, the Board found that relief was warranted. The Board carefully considered the applicant's record of service, documents submitted in support of the petition, and executed a comprehensive review based on law, policy, and regulation. The Board reviewed and concurred with the U.S. Army Reserve Command's advising

official and determined the evidence supports the applicant submitted her DA Forms 1380 for the duty performed during January 2023 and July 2023 for a total of six additional non-paid retirement points.

BOARD DETERMINATION/RECOMMENDATION:

The Board determined the evidence presented is sufficient to warrant a recommendation for relief. As a result, the Board recommends that all Department of the Army records of the individual concerned be corrected by awarding the applicant qualifying retirement points on the dates indicated below, provided all other criteria is met:

- 2 non-paid retirement points for 1 January 2023
- 2 non-paid retirement points for 15 July 2023
- 2 non-paid retirement points for 16 July 2023

REFERENCES:

Army Regulation 140-185, Training and Retirement Points Credits and Unit Level Strength Accounting Records, sets responsibilities and procedures to establish and maintain retirement records prescribing the types of training and activities for which retirement points are authorized. Paragraph 3-3 covers the DA Form 1380:

a. The purpose of this form is to record IDT (Inactive Duty Training) by—

(1) Troop Program Unit (TPU) Soldiers performing IDT assemblies when pay is authorized, and the Soldier is not present to sign the IDT attendance roster.

(2) TPU Soldiers attached to another USAR (U.S. Army Reserve) unit for 89 or fewer days. In such cases the unit of attachment will prepare DA Form 1380 and forward to unit of assignment for recording attendance.

(3) Non-unit Soldiers under the jurisdiction of AHRC who are attached for retirement points only to USAR TPUs, ARNG units, or to another Service or component for training per AR 140–10. Only attached Soldiers are authorized to perform IDT with the exception of one annual physical health assessment each for medical and dental readiness when authorized by the command prior to the event. Note: Non-unit Soldiers attached for retirement point credit to IMA (Individual Mobilization Augmentee) detachments are reported on DA Form 1379 for those units.

(4) Non-unit Soldiers performing other inactive duty training for retirement point credit as outlined in table 2–3.

b. The DA Form 1380 will be prepared for a unit Soldier who performs ET (equivalent training) or additional training with their unit subsequent to the scheduled BA (battle Assembly). TPU units will retain one copy of the DA Form 1380 to post the appropriate entry into ADARS (Automated Drill Attendance Reporting Software) for the month's report and then place in the appropriate Army records information management system file. Nonpaid DA Forms 1380 will not be entered into ADARS and will be forwarded to AHRC for award of retirement points no later than the end of each duty month. The DA Form 1380 will be scanned into the Soldier's iPERMS by the unit of assignment.
