<u>APPLICANT REQUESTS:</u> correction of his DD Form 214 (Armed Forces of the United States Report of Transfer or Discharge) to show his date of birth (DOB) as 7 XXX instead of 8 XXX.

APPLICANT'S SUPPORTING DOCUMENT(S) CONSIDERED BY THE BOARD:

- DD Form 149 (Application for Correction of Military Record)
- Certificate of Birth, 7 XXX

FACTS:

- 1. The applicant did not file within the 3-year time frame provided in Title 10, U.S. Code, section 1552(b); however, the Army Board for Correction of Military Records (ABCMR) conducted a substantive review of this case and determined it is in the interest of justice to excuse the applicant's failure to timely file.
- 2. The applicant states, in effect, the DOB on his DD Form 214 is incorrect, and he is requesting that it be corrected to show the appropriate administrative information.
- 3. The applicant provides a copy of his certificate of birth which reflects the requested DOB, 7 XXX
- 4. A review of the applicant's service record shows:
- a. He enlisted in the Regular Army on 6 October 1969. His DD Form 4 (Enlistment Contract Armed Forces of the United States) shows in Block 21 (DOB), 8 XXX the contested DOB.
- b. DA Form 20 (Enlisted Qualification Record) shows his DOB as 8 XXX , the contested DOB.

- c. The applicant was honorably discharged on 13 May 1971. His DD Form 214 shows in Item 9 (DOB), 8 XXX , the contested DOB. The applicant authenticated this form with his signature.
- 5. By regulation, the DD Form 214 is a summary of the Soldier's most recent period of continuous active duty. It provides a brief, clear-cut record of all current active, prior active, and prior inactive duty service at the time of release from active duty, retirement, or discharge. The information entered thereon reflects the conditions as they existed at the time of separation.

BOARD DISCUSSION:

After reviewing the application and all supporting documents, the Board determined relief was not warranted. The applicant's contentions, the military record, and regulatory guidance were carefully considered. Based upon the applicant using the contested DOB during his entire period of military service and the lack of justification provided by the applicant for the initial error, the Board concluded there was insufficient evidence of an error or injustice warranting a change to the applicant's DOB.

BOARD DETERMINATION/RECOMMENDATION:

The evidence presented does not demonstrate the existence of a probable error or injustice. Therefore, the Board determined the overall merits of this case are insufficient as a basis for correction of the records of the individual concerned.

REFERENCES:

- 1. Title 10, U.S. Code, section 1552(b), provides that applications for correction of military records must be filed within 3 years after discovery of the alleged error or injustice. This provision of law also allows the ABCMR to excuse an applicant's failure to timely file within the 3-year statute of limitations if the ABCMR determines it would be in the interest of justice to do so.
- 2. Army Regulation 635-5 (Separation Documents), in effect at the time, prescribed the separation documents prepared for Soldiers upon retirement, discharge, or release from active military service or control of the Army. It established standardized policy for the preparation of the DD Form 214. It provides a brief, clear-cut record of active Army service at the time of release from active duty, retirement, or discharge. The version in effect at the time stated that Item 9 (DOB) was self-explanatory.
- 3. Army Regulation 635-8 (Separation and Processing Documents), currently in effect, states the DD Form 214 is a summary of the Soldier's most recent period of continuous active duty. It provides a brief, clear-cut record of all current active, prior active, and prior inactive duty service at the time of release from active duty, retirement, or discharge. The information entered thereon reflects the conditions as they existed at the time of separation. For Block 5 (DOB), it states verify data accuracy by reviewing original enlistment contract and/or application for appointment.
