Discharge Review Board Discussion and Decision:

DISCUSSION:

The applicant was discharged with an Under Honorable Conditions discharge due to Misconduct stemming from Involvement with Drugs (positive urinalysis).

Thereafter, the command initiated action pursuant to policy to discharge the applicant.

The Board finds no issues with propriety or equity in this case. The applicant offered no new evidence on their behalf to refute the findings of the discharge.

Coast Guard policy prescribes no higher than a General, Under Honorable Conditions character of service for individuals separated as a result of violating the Coast Guard's drug policy. The Coast Guard has zero tolerance for drug abuse. The General, Under Honorable Conditions discharge is equitable.

Propriety: Discharge was proper.

Equity: Discharge was equitable.

Final Adjudication by Assistant Commandant For Human Resources: No relief

In reviewing discharges, the Board presumes regularity in the conduct of governmental affairs unless there is substantial credible evidence (to include evidence submitted by the Applicant) to rebut the presumption.
