Discharge Review Board Discussion and Decision:

DISCUSSION:

The Applicant was discharged after attending initial training, only spending a total of 18 days on Active Duty Orders.

The applicant received a DD-214 with the 18 days of service. The Coast Guard Personnel Manual (COMDTINST 1000.6, 12.B.20) defines Uncharacterized Discharges are authorized for all members separated at the entry level who have served less than 30 days and exhibit minor pre-existing medical issues not of a disabling nature which do not meet the medical/physical procurement standards in place for entry into the Service. The Applicant received a Separation Code of JFW indicating the Applicant had a medical condition and therefore, met the requirement of COMDTINST M1000.6, 12.B.20. The Board had no issue with the Propriety or Equity in this case.

Propriety: Discharge was proper. Equity: Discharge was equitable.

Board Conclusion: The Board voted 5-0 to recommend no relief.

In reviewing discharges, the Board presumes regularity in the conduct of governmental affairs unless there is substantial credible evidence (to include evidence submitted by the Applicant) to rebut the presumption.
