This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to the provisions of title 10 of the United States Code, section 1552.

A three-member panel of the Board for Correction of Naval Records, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 31 July 2001. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations and policies. In addition, the Board considered the advisory opinion furnished by BUPERS memorandum 1780 PERS 604 of 3 July 2001, a copy of which is attached.

After careful and conscientious consideration of the entire record, the Board found that the evidence submitted was insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. In this connection, the Board substantially concurred with the comments contained in the advisory opinion. Accordingly, your application has been denied. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request.

It is regretted that the circumstances of your case are such that favorable action cannot be taken. You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new and material evidence or other matter not previously considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.

1. The following is provided in response to reference (a):

a. Recommend the Board deny EM3 [REDACTED] request to add Navy College Fund (NCF) Program guarantee to his master record. NCF Program, as well as the Enlistment Bonus (EB) Program, is an enlistment incentive program that can only be offered at the time of enlistment. At the time of EM3 [REDACTED] enlistment, by law, NCF Program could not be offered to recruits opting for the EB Program. Both programs are offered at the sole discretion of the classifier. The Enlistment Document (DD Form 4) is the official document used to identify all enlistment guarantees.

b. A review of EM3 [REDACTED] DD Form 4 indicates on 17 May 1999 he was guaranteed "Fireman Apprenticeship Program and \$4,000 Enlistment Bonus Program," but not NCF Program. Because EM3 [REDACTED] was offered an enlistment bonus, at the time of his enlistment, by law, he could not be offered NCF Program. All guarantees are fully explained to every recruit at enlistment and during recruit basic training. Additionally, EM3 [REDACTED] signed and initialed the annex to his DD Form 4 indicating he reviewed this document and the information was correct. No administrative inconsistencies pertaining to enlistment guarantees exist in his master record.

2. EM3 [REDACTED] elected to enroll in the Montgomery GI Bill (MGIB) Program on 2 June 1999. The present educational assistance benefit for in-service use is limited to the actual cost of tuition and fees. When EM3 [REDACTED] receives an Honorable discharge, he will be entitled to receive 36 months of MGIB Program benefits. The current educational benefit for full time enrollment in school is \$650.00 per month. The monthly entitlement is adjusted yearly based on the Consumer Price Index.
