- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with this Board requesting, in effect, that the applicable naval record be corrected by removing the reviewing officer's certification from the fitness report for 3 May 1996 to 6 May 1997, a copy of which is at Tab A to enclosure (1). As indicated in enclosure (2), the Headquarters Marine Corps (HQMC) Performance Evaluation Review Board (PERB) has directed removal of the contested certification. Petitioner further requested removal of his failure of selection before the Fiscal Year 2002 Active Reserve Major Selection Board, so as to be considered by the selection board that next convenes to consider officers of his category for promotion to the grade of major as an officer who has not failed of selection to that grade.
- 2. The Board, consisting of Messrs. Brezna, Pfeiffer, and Swarens, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 28 November 2001, and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, naval records, and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.
- 3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:
- a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.
- b. In correspondence attached as enclosure (3), the HQMC office having cognizance over the subject matter of Petitioner's request to strike his failure of selection for promotion has commented to the effect that this request has merit and warrants favorable action.

CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (3), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action.

RECOMMENDATION:

- That Petitioner's record be corrected so that he will be considered by the earliest possible selection board convened to consider officers of his category for promotion to major as an officer who has not failed of selection for promotion to that grade.
- That any material or entries inconsistent with or relating to the Board's recommendation be corrected, removed or completely expunged from Petitioner's record and that no such entries or material be added to the record in the future.
- That any material directed to be removed from Petitioner's naval record be returned to the Board, together with a copy of this Report of Proceedings, for retention in a confidential file maintained for such purpose, with no cross reference being made a part of Petitioner's naval record.
- 4. Pursuant to Section 6(c) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(c)) it is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.



- 1. Per reference (a), we have reviewed Captain record to determine his competitiveness for selection to major. In our opinion, Captain record, without the reviewing officer comments from the fitness report for the period 960503 to 970506, would be more competitive with the majority of his peers based on the following:
- a. Captain itness reports reflect no negative trends in any categories. Generally, he has been ranked 1 of 1 in the old fitness report system. In the two times he has been ranked against his peers he has been 1 of 2, and ranked in the excellent to outstanding block, with four above him.
- b. Comments from the remaining fitness reports are positive from both reporting seniors and reviewing officers; "be willing to have him command a platoon," "High impact starter & quick study," "Augment now," "Top 10%-er," "ahead of peers" and "promote with peers."
- c. Captair PME complete for his grade. He has been awarded a Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal, and a Navy Achievement Medal. His most recent fitness report indicates a first class PFT score of 209.
