

This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to the provisions of title 10 of the United States Code, section 1552.

You requested removal of your fitness reports for 1 March to 28 August 1998 and 1 October to 14 November 1998, as well as documentation of your relief for the good of the service from recruiting duty.

It is noted that the Commandant of the Marine Corps (CMC) has directed modification of the report for 1 March to 28 August 1998 by deleting the following from section C:

Report submitted due to SNM [subject named Marine]'s voidance of 8411 MOS [military occupational specialty] for back injury sustained in an auto accident which has complicated her pregnancy & placed her in a bed rest/no duty status until after the birth of her child. Awaiting humanitarian transfer to I - I [inspector - instructor].

Further, the third sentence of section C of the same report is to be modified by deleting the words "prior to the accident," so the sentence, as amended will read as follows: "Recruited for 3 months of this period & did an excellent job [emphasis in original]." CMC also directed modification of the report for 1 October to 14 November 1998 by deleting the following from section C:

SNM was put on bed rest/no duty due to pregnancy problems/back problems. SNM is being transferred by SRB [service record book] to I & I Houston due to pregnancy and back problems. Pregnant. This report is late due to administrative oversight.

Finally, CMC directed removal of the relief for the good of the service documentation.

A three-member panel of the Board for Correction of Naval Records, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 21 March 2002. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations and policies. In addition, the Board considered the report of the Headquarters Marine Corps (HQMC) Performance Evaluation Review Board (PERB), dated 11 January 2002, the advisory opinion from the HQMC Manpower Information Systems Field Support Branch, Manpower Management Information Systems Support Division, dated 8 March 2002 with enclosure, and the memorandum for the record dated 18 March 2002, copies of which are attached.

After careful and conscientious consideration of the entire record, the Board found that the evidence submitted was insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. In this connection, the Board substantially concurred with the comments contained in the report of the PERB in finding that complete removal of the contested fitness reports, as amended, is not warranted. Accordingly, your application for relief beyond that effected by CMC has been denied. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request.

It is regretted that the circumstances of your case are such that favorable action cannot be taken. You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new and material evidence or other matter not previously considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.

- 1. Per MCO 1610.11C, the Performance Evaluation Review Board, with three members present, met on 9 January 2002 to consider Staff Sergeant petition contained in reference (a). Removal of the following fitness reports was requested:
 - a. Report A 980301 to 980828 (CD)
 - b. Report B 981001 to 981114 (TR)

Reference (b) is the performance evaluation directive governing the submission of both reports.

- 2. The petitioner believes that since the voidance of her 8411 MOS was overturned, and her records were corrected to reflect completion of a successful tour on recruiting duty, removal of the challenged fitness reports is warranted.
- 3. In its proceedings, the PERB concluded that:
- a. Report A should be corrected by eliminating any and all reference to the voidance of her 8411 MOS, as well as information not directly relevant to her change of duty. They also found the verbiage in Report B to be redundant concerning her medical problems and pregnancy. To this end, the Board has directed modification of the fitness reports as indicated:
- (1) Report A. Elimination of the following verbiage: "Report submitted due to SNM's voidance of 8411 MOS for back injury sustained in an auto accident which has complicated her pregnancy & placed her in a bed rest/no duty status until after the birth of her child. Awaiting humanitarian transfer approval to I-I."

- (2) Report B. Elimination of the following verbiage: "SNM was put on bed rest/no duty due to pregnancy problems/back problems. SNM is being transferred by SRB to pregnancy and back problems. Pregnant. This report is late due to administrative oversight."
- b. The Board does not agree with the petitioner that complete removal of either report is warranted. Report A is consistent with other fitness reports the petitioner received while on recruiting duty and Report B is nothing more than a "not observed" evaluation.
- 4. The Board's opinion, based on deliberation and secret ballot vote, is that the contested fitness reports, as modified, should remain a part of Staff Sergean official military record.
- 5. The case is forwarded for final action.
