

Dear Lieutena

This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to the provisions of title 10 of the United States Code, section 1552. You requested that your lieutenant date of rank be adjusted to make you three years more junior, and that your failure of selection by the Fiscal Year 01 Staff Lieutenant Commander Selection Board be removed.

A three-member panel of the Board for Correction of Naval Records, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 7 February 2002. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations and policies. In addition, the Board considered the advisory opinions furnished by the Navy Personnel Command dated 28 November 2000, 28 June and 30 August 2001, copies of which are attached.

After careful and conscientious consideration of the entire record, the Board found that the evidence submitted was insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. In this connection, the Board substantially concurred with the advisory opinion dated 28 June 2001 in concluding your request for date of rank adjustment should be denied. As they found insufficient grounds to adjust your date of rank, they had no basis to remove your failure of selection for promotion. In view of the above, your application has been denied. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request.

It is regretted that the circumstances of your case are such that favorable action cannot be taken. You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new and material evidence or other matter not previously considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.

- 1. Enclosure (1) is returned, recommending disapproval of LT Color request for a three-year adjustment to his date of rank for LT and removal his failure of selection to LCDR.
- 2. Per references (b) and (c), the Secretary of the Navy can change a date of rank to a later date effective when the officer is placed on the active-duty list if: 1) the officer has not been on continuous active duty since his original appointment as a reserve commissioned officer, or 2) is transferred from an inactive status to an active status and placed on the active-duty list. This request must be made and approved prior to making the transition from the Reserve Active Status List to the Active Status List. Was recalled to active duty in July 1997 his request for date of rank adjustment needed to be done prior to his recall in 1997.

4. Recommend disapproval of request. PERS-86 should be consulted for additional advisory opinions regarding reserve service is needed.

While the ultimate determining factor is his performance as documented on his fitness reports, he clearly did not have the number or the type of tours as his active duty counterparts.
